THE following further Addresses and Resolutions of Congratulation on the occasion of Her Majesty having attained the Fiftieth Year of Her Reign, which have been transmitted to the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, have been laid before Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously:—

To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

WE, the Lord Lieutenant, High Sheriff, Nobility, Knights of the Shire, Magistrates, Mayors, Clergy, and Inhabitants generally of the county of Hertford, humbly approach Your Majesty to offer our dutiful and loyal homage on this the Jubilee of Your Majesty's most illustrious Reign.

Although the county of Hertford is small compared with many others in England, both as to area and population, we presume, with pardonable pride, to refer to those of our shire whom Your Majesty has, from time to time, invited into Your Councils to assist You in improving the condition of Your people throughout the extended sphere of this Your great Empire, and in impressing Your Majesty's supreme authority and the influence of Your Kingdom and its dependencies among the nations of the world.

We gratefully recall the sympathy You have so tenderly shown towards suffering of every kind among Your subjects, wherever resident, while we remember with grief the irreparable loss of the revered Prince Consort and other personal sorrows that have afflicted Your Royal person. That by the blessing of the Almighty Your lengthened Reign may long be continued in the enjoyment of peace, in Your personal happiness and health, and in the gratitude of a happy people, united in loyal allegiance to Your Throne and Person, is the fervent prayer of Your most dutiful subjects who now address You.
