Charles Seymour Clarke, of Scarborough, to be Trustee under this scheme of arrangement. The Trustee and all necessary parties, when required by Mr. Edmund Minson Wavell, to execute a deed vesting all the effects of the debtor or the Trustee in and about the Alexandra Hotel, Bridlington Quay, and comprised in the bill of sale thereof, dated the 24th day of June, 1884, and such other (if any) the furniture and effects in and about the said hotel as may belong to the debtor in the said Edmund Minson Wavell absolutely. The said sum of £671 16s. 11d. when received by Trustee to be dealt with by him in the manner hereinafter mentioned, but with due regard to the payment of all debts entitled to priority as under the provisions of the Bankruptcy Act, namely:—(1.) In paying the fees of this Court, and all proper costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the proceedings, and all fees and percentages payable to the Official Receiver and Board of Trade, and also in priority to other debts and all debts by the Act directed to be so paid. (2.) In paying the party and party costs of the claimants and defendant in the said interpleader proceedings. (3.) The costs of Messrs. T. and A. Priestman as the petitioning creditor's Solicitors, and those of Messrs. Wells, Gething, and Stanley, the debtor's Solicitors. (4.) In discharge of the Trustee's expenses. (5.) In distributing the balance of the said money amongst the creditors of the debtor as they are entitled thereto under the provisions of the Bankruptcy Act. The Receiving Order is rescinded |
