(Swine-Fever.)

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 19th day of September, 1887.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

An Area in the borough of Devonport comprising the piggeries, buildings, and lands situate at or near St. Levan-road and Ford Hill within the said borough and in the several occupations of John Lisle, John Skilley, John Date, Samuel Martin, Richard Hawking, William Browning, William George Weeks, Thomas Lidstone, Joseph Parnell, William Strong, Holland Treleven, and John Batten.

#### (PLEURO-PREUMONIA.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered. as follows:

1. The limits of the following Place which is declared by order of the Executive Committee of the Local Authority of the county of Northumberland, dated the ninth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—the cow-shed situated at South Steads Farm, in the chapelry of Widdrington, in the

county of Northumberland, in the occupation of Mr. James Hay, together with all the Farm of South Steads aforesaid and all the farm buildings thereon in the same occupation,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuropneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twentieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven

#### SCHEDULE.

A Place comprising the cow-shed situated at South Steads Farm, in the chapelry of Widdrington, in the county of Northumberland, in the occupation of Mr. James Hay, together with all the Farm of South Steads aforesaid and all the farm buildings thereon in the same occupation, and also the field immediately contiguous to the said Farm known as the Big Field in the occupation of Mr. William Potts.

#### (PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows

1. The following Area (namely),—the burgh of Dysart,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-soven.
