

And whereas by another Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning "the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the twentieth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, in so far as it affects burials in the parish church and churchyard of Cottingham, in the county of York, should be varied, and that the directions hereinafter set forth should be substituted for those contained in the said Order, with respect to burials in the said church and churchyard:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the twelfth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken in consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed as required by the said first-recited Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered:—

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Cottingham, in the county of York; and also in the original churchyard and the part added in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, except as follows:

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented; and except for the burial, at their decease, of the Reverend C. Overton, Mr. G. B. Stevenson, and Mrs. Sarah Wright.
