The Humble, Loyal, and Dutiful Address of the Kidderminster Chamber of Commerce.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, Your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful subjects, the President, Vice-President, and Members generally of the Kidderminster Chamber of Commerce in special meeting assembled, actuated by the sincerest feelings of loyalty and attachment to Your Person and Throne, humbly and respectfully desire to offer to Your Majesty our congratulations upon the completion of the Fiftieth Year of Your Reign, and to express our sincere thankfulness for the material progress and prosperity which has accrued to the nation at large under Your Majesty's beneficent sway.
