1. The following Area (namely),-the borough of Grantham,-which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swinefever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

pleuro-pneumonia. 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.
