THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Places (namely),—(1.) the whole of the farm steading and buildings on and the whole lands of Southfield, in the parish of Leuchars, in the county of Fife, in the occupation of John Rattray, farmer there, including the lands of Gallowhill, the Midfield Gallowhill grass field, in the occupation of or sub-let to Robert Law, Hugh Anderson, David Tullis, and John Dawson, and also the field on Southfield lying to the south of Brackmont Mill, in the occupation of or sub-let to David Inglis: the highway leading from Bal-mullo to St. Michael's between the last-mentioned field and the other lands of Southfield not being included within the Area, and (2.) the whole steading and farm buildings on and lands of the Farm of Carabee, in the parish of Carabee, in the county of Fife, in the occupation of Sir Ralph William Anstruther, Part., including the park in the said parish of Carabee, in the occupation of the said Sir Ralph William Anstruther, Bart., and William Grubb, blacksmith, lying to the north and west of Carnbee Public-School and immediately contiguous thereto, and comprising also the byre and other premises at Carnbee village, in the said parish of Carnbee, and in the occupation of the said William Grubb, adjoining the road from Carnbee to Pittenweem and situate about eighty yards south of the said Carnbee Public-School,—which were declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with

pleuro-pneumonia.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

To provide for the maintenance and repair by the Corporation, their lessees, or other persons, bodies, or authorities of any streets, roads, highways, thoroughfares, or places upon or along which any of the intended tramways, may for the time being be laid, and to exempt the Corporation from the payment of the whole or some part of any highway or other rate or assessment in respect of any portion or part of any street, road, or place upon or along which any of the intended tramways may be laid.

7. To provide for and regulate the use and disposition by the Corporation for the purposes of the intended tramways, of any paving, metalling, or road material or things found during the construction or repair of any of the intended tramways and works, and the owner-

ship and disposal of any surplus paving, metalling, or materials.

8. To enable the Corporation to use the intended tramways for the conveyance of scavenging stuff, road metal, and other materials required for the works of the Corporation free of all tolls and charges in respect of such use.

9. 11. To enable the Corporation from time to time when, by reason of the execution of any work in or affecting the surface or soil of any street, road, highway, or thoroughfare in which any tramway shall be laid, it is necessary or expedient so to do, to alter, remove, or discontinue such tramway or any part thereof, to make and lay down in the same or any adjacent street, road, or thoroughfare in the said townships of Leeds, Potternewton, and Roundhay, and maintain, so long as occasion may require, a temporary tramway, or temporary tramways, in lieu of the tramway, or part of a tramway, so removed or discontinued to be used, or intended so to be.

12. To enable the Corporation or their lessees, and any vestry, highway surveyors, local authorities, or persons having respectively the duty of directing the repairs or the control or management of the said streets, roads, and places respectively to enter into contracts or agreements with respect to the laying down, maintaining, renewing, repairing, working, and using of the intended tramways, and the works connected therewith, and for facilitating the passage of carriages and traffic over or along the same, and for the payment of a composition or adjusted or modified tolls or duties in respect of the user of the streets, roads, and places along which the said tramways will be constructed, and for securing the carrying out of the said tramways and the undertaking to be authorised by the Provisional Order, and to confirm any agreement or agreements which have or has already been made, or may hereafter be made, with reference to any of these matters.
