By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

I. The following Area (namely),—at Church Gate Farm, situate near Ticehurst village, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, in the occupation of Daniel Balcombe, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road from Burwash to Ticehurst town on the east, the boundary hedge of Great Chequers field on the south, the boundary hedge of Little Chequers field and Townsend meadow on the west, and the hedge of the said Townsend meadow on the north,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fifteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of London as a foreign animals quarantine station (in this Order called the Quarantine Station):

All that space situate at Gallions Wharf at the Royal Albert Dock, in the county of Essex, the property of the London and St. Katharine Docks Company, lying between Gallions Railway Station and the River Thames extending to and including the New Lock at the eastern end of the said Dock, and including so much of the roadway as lies between the water edge of the said Lock and the shed known as the Gallions Baggage Shed, and also including the said Gallions Baggage Shed.

And do hereby prescribe as follows:

- 1. When landed the animals shall forthwith be placed in the Gallions Baggage Shed and shall be there kept until moved thereout in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 144 of The Animals Order of 1886.
- 2. When and so soon as an Inspector of the Privy Council shall have certified in writing that all parts of the Quarantine Station with which the animals or their droppings have come in contact in their passage to the said Gallions Baggage Shed have been cleansed and disinfected to his satisfaction, all parts of the space above defined, other than the said Shed, shall cease to be included in the Quarantine Station, and thereupon, for the purposes of this Order, the said Gallions Baggage Shed shall alone be deemed to be the Quarantine Station hereby defined.

BLACK SEA.

Storm Signals.

THE Russian Government has given notice, dated 19th September, 1887, that the following storm signals (consisting of day and night signals) would be made at the undermentioned ports in the Black Sea:-

The signals are shown for 48 hours, unless instructions are received to lower them before that time has elapsed; also, the cause assigned for hoisting each signal will be posted up at the respective signal stations.

The day signals consist of a cone, hoisted either alone, or with a drum, both painted black, and each about three feet in diameter.

The night signals consist of three red lights, hoisted at the angles of an equilateral triangle, of the same size as the cone used by day.

Day Signals.

A cone, apex upwards, indicates that a gale is expected from the semicircle, N.W., round by north, to S.E.

A cone, apex downwards, indicates that a gale is expected from the semicircle, S.E., round by south, to N.W.

A cone, apex upwards, above a drum, indicates that a heavy gale is expected from the semicircle N.W., round by north, to S.E.

A cone, apex downwards, below a drum, indicates that a heavy gale is expected from the semicircle, S.E., round by south, to N.W.

Night Signals.

Three red lights, in the shape of a triangle, apex upwards, indicate that a gale is expected from the semicircle, N.W., round by north, to
