for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in

Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, being :-

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Emmanuel Streatham in the county of Surrey, and in the diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the south-east partly by the new parish of All Saints Norwood, partly by the new parish of Saint Paul Thornton Heath, and partly by the new parish of Christ Church Broad Green, the three last-mentioned cures being in the said county of Surrey and in the diocese of Canterbury upon the south-west by the parish of Mitcham, in the said county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester aforesaid, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say upon the north-west and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Mitcham from the new parish of Emmanuel Streatham aforesaid at a point in the middle of Greyhound-lane and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of thirty-seven and one-half chains or thereabouts thereby crossing the line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway, to the point near the Streatham Common Railway Station where the same lane joins Ellison-road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with Kempshott-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the lastnamed road for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to its junction with Croydon-road and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one and three-quarter chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called or known as Baldrygardens, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its present north-eastern end, and extending thence south-eastward for a distance of twenty one and one-half chains or thereabouts in a course parallel to, and distant eleven chains from the middle of Croydon-road aforesaid, to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Emmanuel Streatham from the new parish of All Saints Norwood aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven sections six and eight duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventeenth day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirtyseven have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the parish of Ilsington in the

county of Devon now vested in us:-

"Whereas under and by virtue of an indenture bearing date the twentieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty seven and made between the Reverend Thomas Hale, vicar of the vicarage of the said parish of Ilsington of the first part us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the second part, the Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of Saint George within His Castle of Windsor, patrons of the said vicarage of the third part, and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England of the fourth part certain pieces or parcels of land situate in the said parish of Ilsington and containing one acre two roods and thirty-one perches more or less, being the fields numbered 1366 and 1366A in the schedule to the confirmed apportionment of tithe rent-charge for the said parish of Ilsington became and are now vested in us.

"And whereas the said pieces or parcels of land are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in possession, but on account of their character and situation the same are unsuitable and inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our

proceedings are governed.

**. "And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said pieces or parcels of land or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in the same or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered, by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, the said pieces or parcels of land so vested in us as aforesaid or any part or parts thereof with their appurtenances and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the pur-
