By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

SCHEDULE.

An Area in the parish of Ore, in the petty sessional division of Hastings, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Tunnel on the north side of London-road near Ivy Cottage, along Ivy House-lane to Chownes Hill-lane, thence in a straight line in an easterly direction to the South Eastern Railway at the point where the stream crosses the said Railway, and thence along the said Railway to the Tunnel at London-road aforesaid.
