Twin, July 8. The Duke of Savey removed his Camp on the 6th lastant from Moncalier rearer to Monticur Catinat, and lyes now within 3 miles of him. Several French Deserters come daily into our Camp, and report, that Provisions are very searce in the French Army, and that the Horse suffer very much for want of Forage. The Vinelass continue to do them a great deal of missibility and have so closely block'd up 500 French, that had put themselves into the Fort Della Torre in the Valley of Latring, that they will not be able long to substituting with there. The Enemy in the mean time have made several attempts to lay a Bridge over the Po, to open a Communication with Calal, but the Militia that are posted on the other side of that River, liave hitherto hindred them from essential their design.
