(SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of January, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising the whole of the parish of Crickhowell, in the county of Brecknock.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 3rd day of January, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Middlesex, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcasses of any pigs which have been buried recently on any premises in the occupation of Mr. J. W. Lane at Highgate, or at Finchley, in the county of Middlesex, subject to the following conditions:

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a post-mortem examination to be made of the carcasses with a view to ascertain the cause of death of such animals, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcasses to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause them to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, post-mortem examination, and re-burial of the carcasses shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
3. This Licence is revocable by the Privy Council.
