

The Queen, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Grand Duke of Hesse, K.G., The Duke of Connaught and Strathearne, K.G., and The Duchess of Connaught and Strathearne, The Princess Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, Princess Helena of Great Britain and Ireland, The Princess Henry of Battenberg, Princess Beatrice of Great Britain and Ireland, The Hereditary Grand Duke of Hesse, G.C.B., Her Grand Ducal Highness The Princess Irène of Hesse, His Serene Highness The Prince Louis of Battenberg, G.C.B., and attended by The Dowager Duchess of Roxburghe, Lady of the Bedchamber in Waiting; The Hon. Evelyn Paget, Maid of Honour in Waiting; General The Right Hon. Her Majesty travelled by a special train on the South Western Railway, and reached the Castle shortly before 7 o'clock.

Her Majesty left Windsor at 3.30 o'clock, accompanied by Their Royal Highnesses The Grand Duke of Hesse, K.G., The Prince Henry of Battenberg, K.G., The Princess Henry of Battenberg, Princess Beatrice of Great Britain and Ireland, and Their Grand Ducal Highnesses The Princesses Irène and Alix of Hesse, and travelled by a special train on the Great Western and Great Northern Railways to Hatfield, where Her Majesty arrived at 5 o'clock.
