THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—all the fields and out-buildings therein adjoining to the Nordgeshall Farm, in the parish of Wingrave, in the county of Buckingham, in the occupation of Mr. William Manning,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
