Hammersmith Police Court and the Wandsworth Police Court shall be served conjointly by three Magistrates who shall be appointed to the said Courts conjointly."

And Her Majesty is further pleased by and with the advice of Her said Council to order and it is hereby ordered accordingly that this Order shall take effect on and from the second day of April; one thousand eight hundred and eightyeight.

And the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. C. L. Peel.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W HEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the second and third years of Her Majesty's reign initialed "An Act for regulating the Police Courts in the Metropolis," it was, amongst other things, enacted, that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Conncil to alter the number of the Police Courts, and to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the said Courts, and to order such changes to be made of the places in which they should be holden within the Metropolitan Police District as should be found expedient, and every such Court should thenceforth be holden in the place in or to which it

should be so ordered to be established or removed. And whereas also by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the third and fourth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for better defining the Powers of Justices within the Metropolitan Police District" it was amongst other things enacted "that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council from time to time to constitute within the Metropolitan Police District so many Police Court Divisions as to Her Majesty should seem fit and to define the extent thereof and from time to time to alter the number and extent of such Police Court Divisions, and to assign a division to each of the Police Courts already established, and to establish a Police Court for each of the other divisions.

WORSHIP STREET POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty therefore is pleased with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District) that is to say, from the boundary of the city of London in Whitechapel High-street in a line running eastward along the centre thereof and of Whitechapel-road and Mile End-road to Globeroad, thence along the centre of Globe-road to the southern side of the Great Eastern Railway, thence eastward along the same to the River Lee and along the centre of the said river and Hackney Cut to the Hertford Union Canal, thence westward along the centre of the said canal and the Regent's Canal to Shepherdess-walk, thence southward along the centre thereof and of Bathstreet and of Bunhill-row, to the boundary of the city of London, and thence along the said boundary to Whitechapel High-street aforesaid, shall from and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect, constitute a Police Court Division and be assigned to the Police Court called the Worship Street Police Court.

CLERKENWELL POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty is further pleased, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly that the space included within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District) that is to say, from the boundary of the city of London in Type-street in a line running northward along the boundary of the district of the Worship-street Police Court to the Rosemary Branch Bridge on the Regent's Canal, thence northwestward along the centres of Shepperton-road, Rotherfield - street, Canonbury - street, Willow-bridge-road, Grange-road, Highbury-grove, Highbury - park, Highbury - vale, Blackstock - road, Stroud Green-road, and Crouch Hill, thence westward along Hornsey-lane to Dartmouth Parkhill, thence along the centres of Dartmouth Parkhill and Brecknock-road to the Camden-road, thence along the centre thercof to the Red Cap public-house, thence along the centre of Highstreet in Camden Town and of Seymour-street to Euston-road, thence along the boundary of the district assigned to the Bow-street Police Court to the boundary of the city of London at Holborn, and thence along the said city boundary to Typestreet aforesaid, shall on and after the dav appointed for this Order to take effect constitute a Police Court Division and be assigned to the Police Court called Clerkenwell Police Court.

DALSTON POLICE COURT.

Her Majesty is further pleased, with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that the space in-cluded within the following boundary (the same being within the Metropolitan Police District), that is to say, from the boundary of the Worship-street Police Court at the junction of the River Lee with Hackney Cut, northward along the said River Lee to Spring Bridge at Stamford Hill, thence westward to Bayley's-lane and along St. Ann's-road, crossing Green-lanes, and thence in a straight line to the boundary of the district assigned to Clerkenwell Police Court by this Order and thence along the said boundary to the Rosemary Branch Bridge on the Regent's Canal, and thence along the boundary of the district assigned to the Worship-street Police Court by this Order, to the River Lee at its junction with Hackney Cut aforesaid, shall on and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect constitute a Police Court Division and be assigned to a Police Court to be called the Dalston Police Court, which is to be erected or fitted up at a place within the said boundary and near to the Dalston Junction of the North London Railway.

"Her Majesty is further pleased with the advice of Her said Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that on and after the day appointed for this Order to take effect, the Clerkenwell Police Court and the Dalston Police Court shall be served conjointly by three Magistrates, who shall be appointed to the said Courts conjointly, and one of such Magistrates shall attend daily at such respective Courts excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or any day appointed for a Public Fast or Thanksgiving, from ten of the clock in the morning until five of the clock in the afternoon, and longer if (in the discretion of the Magistrate) it shall be deemed to be necessary for the despatch of business.

All former Orders in Council so far as they relate to the Police Court Divisions thereby assigned to the Worship-street Police Court and the Clerkenwell Police Court respectively shall
