THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as

1. The following Area (namely),—in the parish of Ore, in the petty sessional division of Hastings, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Tunnel on the north side of London-road near Ivy Cottage, along Ivy Houselane to Chownes Hill-lane, thence in a straight line in an easterly direction to the South Eastern Railway at the point where the stream crosses the said Railway, and thence along the said Railway to the Tunnel at London-road aforesaid,which was declared by Order of Council dated the sixteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
