By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

An Area at Burwash, in the Eastern Division of the county of Sussex, comprised within the following boundary, that is say, commencing at the main-road (near the Railway Tavern) leading from Burwash to Heathfield on the south, to the boundary edge of the Furs field on Chinshurst Farm occupied by William Hayward and along such hedge on the west, to the boundary hedge of St. Philip's churchyard there on the north, into the high-road from Witherden and thence up such road past the Railway Tavern to the above main-road from Burwash to Heathfield on the east.

NORTH SEA—GERMAN COAST.—WESER RIVER ENTRANCE.

(1.) *Fog Signals at Rother Sand Lighthouse, and Bremen Light-Vessel.*

THE German Government has given notice, dated 21st January, 1888, that the following are the particulars of the fog signals at Rother Sand Lighthouse, and Bremen Light-vessel, entrance to Weser River:—

At Rother Sand Lighthouse, during thick or foggy weather, a bell will be sounded three times, interrupted by short intervals.

At Bremen Light-vessel, during thick or foggy weather, a bell will be sounded six times, interrupted by short intervals.

(2.) *Pilots for Weser River.*

Information has been received from the Master of Pilots, Bremerhaven, dated 21st February, 1888, that there are no pilots for the Weser River on board the Weser Light-vessel. The pilot vessels cruise from Terschelling to the Mouth of the Weser; they are fore and aft schooners, without a fore-topmast, and fly the Bremen Flag, which is red and white, in horizontal stripes, at the mainmast head.

NORWAY—SOUTH AND WEST COASTS.

(3.) *Intended Establishment of Lights, and Alterations in Rödö Light.*

GULF OF MEXICO—ST. GEORGE SOUND.

(1.) *Apalachicola River Entrance—Beacon Leading Lights.*

THE United States Government has given notice, dated 1st March, 1888, that the following leading lights are shown from beacons erected at the entrance of Apalachicola River, St. George Sound:—

The front light is a fixed red light, elevated 15 feet above the water, shown from a triangular pyramidal structure, consisting of 3 iron piles surmounted by a lantern. It is situated in a depth of 8 feet, at the northern end, and eastern edge, of the dredged channel in the entrance of Apalachicola River, with Cape St. George Light-house bearing S.S.W., distant about 8 miles.

Position, approximate, lat. 29° 41' 55" N., long. 84° 54' 10" W.

The rear light is a fixed white light, elevated 17 feet above the water, shown from a triangular pyramidal structure, consisting of 3 iron piles, surmounted by a lantern, the whole painted white. It is situated in a depth of 6 feet, on the eastern bank of Apalachicola River, opposite the town, and bears N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, from the front light.

NOTE.—The above lights in line, bearing N. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., lead through the dredged channel at the entrance of Apalachicola River.

WEST INDIES.—CUBA.

(2.) *Havana Harbour—Semaphore Station on Castillo del Morro.*

Rock Reported North-Eastward of Puerto Cortez.

INFORMATION has been received, that the Master of the steam-vessel "E. B. Margaret Island Bank—Alteration in Position of Light-Buoy.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 280 (2), of 24th October, 1887, on a light buoy having been placed at the west extreme of Margaret Island Bank (Margaret Tail), South Channel of the Traverses, River St. Lawrence:—

ENGLAND—SOUTH COAST.—ISLE OF WIGHT.

(1.) *St. Catherine Point—Intended Alteration in Character of Light and Fog Signal*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 238, of 16th September, 1887, and previous notice, on delay in intended alteration in character of the light and fog signal on St. Catherine Point:—

The Trinity House, London, has given further notice, dated 17th March, 1888, that on 1st May, 1888, the alterations would be carried out:—

The light will be an electric flashing white light, showing a flash of about five seconds duration, every thirty seconds.

Also, that during thick or foggy weather, the fog siren will give two blasts (a high note followed by a low note), in quick succession every minute.

(2.) *Needles—Intended Alteration in Character and Colour of Light.*

The light will be an occulting light, with an occultation once every minute, instead of once every half-minute as at present.

The arc of red light between the bearings of E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. and N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., will be changed to white light, so that the light will then show white between the bearings of E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S., through north, and N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. From the bearing of N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. to the land, where the light is now obscured, it will be visible as a red light. In other respects the light will be unchanged.

RIVER THAMES—NORTHERN APPROACH.

(3.) *Intended Light-Vessel, Exhibiting a Group-Flashing Light, Northward of Gabbard Sands.*

WHEREAS the population of the said liberty of Kidbrooke, according to the last census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said liberty held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, on Thursday the 9th day of February, 1888, it was resolved:—

“That an application be made by the Churchwardens to the Local Government Board to put in force in the liberty of Kidbrooke the Act 13 and 14 Vict., cap. 57, so far as the same relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk.”

ARTICLE I.—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said liberty of Kidbrooke, and the provisions contained in Articles II. and III. of this Order shall apply to the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed to the said liberty.

ARTICLE II.—The duties of the Vestry Clerk shall be as follows, namely,—

To give notices of and attend the meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the account of all charity moneys which the Churchwardens or Overseers are authorised or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry books and the Parish deeds and documents, and the Rate books and Accounts which are closed, and to give copies of and extracts from the same to

any person entitled thereto, such person paying for the same at the rate of fourpence for every seventy-two words or figures, and to permit any person or persons rated to the relief of the Poor of the said liberty at all reasonable times to inspect the same or any of them, on pain of dismissal for neglecting to give such copies or permit such inspection.

To prepare and issue the necessary process for recovering of arrears of Poor and other Parochial Rates respectively before the justices, and procure the summons to be served and to attend the justices thereon, and advise the Churchwardens and Overseers as to the recovery of such arrears.

To assist the Overseers in making out their accounts (whenever required by them) and, subject to the rules and regulations of the Local Government Board, to examine from time to time the accounts of the Assistant Overseers or Collectors of Poor Rates, and their returns of arrears.

To attend the audit of accounts of the Overseers, and conduct all correspondence arising therefrom.

To assist the Churchwardens or Overseers in preparing and making out all other parochial assessments and accounts, and in examining the accounts of the Collectors of such assessments.

To ascertain and make out the list of persons liable to serve on juries, and to cause them to be printed and duly published and returned to the justices.

To give the notices for claims to vote for Members of Parliament, and to make out lists of voters, and to get the same printed and published and duly returned according to law, and to attend the court for revising them, and to prepare the lists of Constables.

To make all returns required of the Churchwardens or of the Overseers by law or proper authority.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office, and also to perform such other duties and services of a like nature as the Local Government Board from time to time, at the request of the Churchwardens and Overseers of the said Liberty, or otherwise, shall prescribe and direct to be performed by the Vestry Clerk.

ARTICLE III.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said liberty shall pay to the Vestry Clerk a salary at the rate of fifty-two pounds and ten shillings per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as we may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.
