A'T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of May, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—in the county of Fife comprising the whole farm steading of Auchmuty in the parish Markinch, in the occupation of John Stirling, together with the steading or premises at Warout, in the parish of Kinglassie, in the occupation of Robert Tullis, and of John Galloway, Game Keeper, as also the lands or fields lying between Warout and Auchmuty farm steading in the parish of Markinch, in the occupation of John Stirling,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight; to be a Place infected with

pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty eight.
