THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following copy of a Notice, dated 8th instant, which has been forwarded by Her Majesty's Representative at Rome:—

The Minister of the Interior Decrees that, after the 10th day of May, it will not be permitted to import into the Kingdom from the foreign ports of the Mediterranean and Adriatic to which the provisions of the Ordinances of 13th February and 18th April are not applicable, rags and second-hand clothes destined for sale, as well as untanned hides, wool, horns, hoofs, bones, and other remains of bovine or ovine animals, unless under the condition that such articles be accompanied by a certificate of origin to be made out by the authorities at the port of embarkation and to be viséed by the Italian Consul or Consular Agent resident there.
