

NOTICE OF INTENDED DISTRIBUTION OF NAVAL PRIZE MONEY.

*Department of the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, May 23, 1888.*

NOTICE is hereby given to the Officers, Seamen, and Marines, and to all persons interested therein, that the distribution of prize money for the slave dhow "Fatal Kheir Abri," captured 22nd May, 1887, by Her Majesty's ship "King-fisher," will commence on Tuesday, the 5th proximo, in the Prize Branch of the Department of the "Accountant - General of the Navy, Admiralty, Spring-gardens, S.W."

Agents and other persons holding powers of attorney, prize orders, assignments, or other instruments, by virtue of which they may be legally entitled to claim the share of any captor serving in the above-named ship, are requested to present the same at this office.

Any Officer, Seaman, Marine, or other person, who may desire to receive his share from the Collector of Customs or of Inland Revenue within the United Kingdom, is required to intimate the same by letter to be addressed "On Prize Business, to the Accountant-General of the Navy, Admiralty, London, S.W." (enclosing his certificate of service, or an attested copy thereof, excepting in the case of Commissioned Officers), —in which letter his own place of residence is to be precisely stated, as well as the place of the nearest Collector of Customs, or of Inland Revenue, from whom it would be convenient to receive such share of prize money.

London Tramways (Various Powers) Bill.  
(Alteration in Works.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that during the progress of the above-mentioned Bill through the House of Commons (in which Honourable House the Bill originated) an alteration has been made in the Works proposed to be authorized by the Bill as introduced into Parliament, by a provision inserted in the Bill, that the tramways to be thereby authorized shall be laid as a double line throughout, whereas on the plans deposited for the Bill in the month of November last, as required by the Standing Orders of both Houses of Parliament, with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Surrey and with the Clerk to the Board of Works for the Wandsworth District, it was shown that in certain parts the Tramways No. 1A and No. 1B proposed to be authorized by the Bill were intended to be laid as single lines.

And notice is hereby also given, that amended plans and sections, showing the said proposed alteration in Works, together with a book of reference to such amended plans, have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Surrey, at his office, at the Sessions House, Newington Causeway, in that county, and with the Clerk to the Board of

Works for the Wandsworth District, at his office, at East Hill, Wandsworth, S.W., and also with the parish clerk of the parish of Streatham, in the county of Surrey, at his residence.

In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862, 1867, and 1877; and in the Matter of the City of Turin Waterworks Limited and Reduced.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order made by Her Majesty's High Court of Justice on the 12th day of May, 1888, in the above-mentioned matter, it was ordered that the cancellation and reduction of the capital of the Company resolved on and effected by the Special Resolution passed and confirmed at two Extraordinary General Meetings of the petitioners, the City of Turin Waterworks Limited and Reduced, held respectively on the 25th of February and the 12th March, 1888, which resolution was in the words and figures following (that is to say): "That the capital of the Company be reduced from £350,000, divided into 14,000 shares of £25 each, to £7,000, divided into 14,000 shares of 10s. each, and that such reduction be effected by cancelling capital which has been lost or is unrepresented by available assets to the extent of £24 10s. upon each of the 3,200 shares which have been issued and are now outstanding, and by reducing the nominal amount of all the shares in the Company's capital from £25 to 10s. per share," be thereby confirmed in conformity with the provisions of the Companies Act, 1867, and the Companies Act, 1877; and it was ordered that the words "and Reduced" form part of the name of "the City of Turin Waterworks Limited" for one month from the date of the Order. And notice is hereby also given, that the said Order has been produced to the Registrar of Joint Stock Companies, and an office copy thereof has been delivered to him, together with a Minute approved by the said Judge in the words and figures following, namely:—"Minute approved by the Court. The capital of the City of Turin Waterworks Limited is £7,000, divided into 14,000 shares of 10s. each, of which 3,200 shares only have been issued, instead of £350,000, divided into 14,000 shares of £25 each. At the time of the registration of this Minute the sum of 10s. has been and is to be deemed paid up on each of the said 3,200 shares," and such Order and Minute have been duly registered by the said Registrar of Joint Stock Companies.—Dated this 28th May, 1888.
