**N**OTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Friday, the 8th of June next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Places (namely),—(1.) in the county of Aberdeen, comprising the byres on the farm of Adziel, in the parish of Strichen, occupied by Alexander Beddie, junior, together with the grass fields on the said farm with the exception of the fields of first years grass, and (2.) in the county of Aberdeen, comprising the byres on the farm of Tarwathie, in the parish of Fraserburgh, occupied by Alexander Henderson, farmer, together with the grass fields on the said farm with the exception of the fields of first years grass,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the eleventh and twelfth days of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

#### THE SCHLESWIG-HOLSTEIN ORDER OF 1888.

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of June, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in

this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. This Order may be cited as The Schleswig-Holstein Order of 1888.
2. This Order extends to England and Wales and Scotland.
3. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1886.
4. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight ; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed on or before that day.
5. Cattle brought from a port or place in either of the parts of the German Empire respectively known as Schleswig and as Holstein, (in this Order referred to as Schleswig-Holstein cattle,) and sheep and goats brought from Schleswig or Holstein in the same vessel with Schleswig-Holstein cattle, may be landed for slaughter in a Foreign Animals Wharf, but not elsewhere.
6. The landing of Schleswig-Holstein cattle in a Foreign Animals Wharf shall be subject to the condition that they are accompanied by a Declaration and Certificates, such as are indicated in the forms in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.
7. If the Declaration accompanying any cattle imported under this Order is untrue in any particular, as regards any one of the cattle to which it relates, the master of the vessel shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878 with respect to all the cattle to which the Declaration relates, unless he shows to the satisfaction of the Justices before whom he is charged, that he did not know of the same being so untrue, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained that knowledge. **(PORT OF SOUTHAMPTON.—APPROVAL OF LANDING-PLACE FOR FOREIGN ANIMALS.)**

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of June, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby approve of the following part of the Port of Southampton as a Landing-Place for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine :

*Landing-Place No. 2.*

All that space in the Southampton Docks within the borough of Southampton, included within a line commencing at a point at the eastern corner of the North Quay to the north-west corner of the New Cattle Shed, enclosed by moveable wooden fencing, a distance of about sixty feet, thence in an easterly direction for about one hundred and twenty feet bounded by the north wall of the Cattle Shed, thence in a southerly direction along the Sea Embankment for a distance of about four hundred and twenty feet, thence in an easterly direction along the Jetty for a distance of about one hundred and fifty feet, thence in a southerly direction about thirty-five feet along the end of the said Jetty, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of about three hundred feet along the edge of the Jetty and Dock Entrance, thence in a northerly direction for a distance of about four hundred and seventy-five feet along the north-east quay of the Open Dock to the point first-mentioned, all which space is coloured yellow on the plan of Southampton Docks deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Southampton.

##### Altrincham Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Altrincham Union, in the County of Chester;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by a General Order bearing date the thirty-first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, made rules and regulations relating to the appointment of Vaccination Officers by Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the said Altrincham Union; and by Article 9 of that Order it was provided as follows:—

"The Guardians shall pay to any Vaccination Officer such salary or remuneration, and such only, as the Local Government Board may direct or approve, whether for ordinary duties or for occasional services; and such salary or remuneration may be increased or reduced as that Board may from time to time direct or approve."

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order as hereinafter mentioned, so far as regards the said Altrincham Union:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby Order that with respect to the said Altrincham Union, the above-cited Article shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso:—

Provided that the Guardians, with the approval of the Local Government Board, may pay to any Vaccination Officer a reasonable compensation on account of extraordinary services, or other unforeseen circumstances connected with his duties or the necessities of the said Union.
