NORTH PACIFIC OCEAN.—SANDWICH ISLANDS.

(1.) *Hawaii—New Lighthouse in Hilo Bay.*

INFORMATION has been received that a new lighthouse, from which the light is now exhibited, has been erected on the site of the old lighthouse, north-westward of Cocopnut Cove, Hilo Bay, eastern coast of Hawaii.

The character of the light is, as heretofore, fixed white; it is elevated 155 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The lighthouse is 33 feet high.

Position, approximate, lat. 19° 45' 30" N., long. 155° 6' 30" W.

NOTE.—It is reported that the exhibition of the above light may be relied upon; but it is difficult to distinguish, as there are numerous lights, apparently equally bright, which may be easily mistaken for Hilo Light, shown from plantations near the lighthouse.

(2.) *Oahu—Fixed Light on Laeloa (Barber) Point.*

Also, that on 9th April, 1888, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse erected on Laeloa (Barber) Point, south-western extreme of Oahu, Sandwich Islands.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 43 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the fourth order.

The lighthouse is constructed of coral. The lantern is painted red.

Position, approximate, lat. 21° 17' 30" N., long. 158° 6' W.
