GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board altering General Consolidated Order: Allowance of Tobacco and Snuff to certain Paupers in the Workhouse:—

Spalding Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Spalding Union, in the county of Lincoln;—And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 24th day of July, 1847, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Spalding Union, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations with regard to the government of the Workhouse or Workhouses of the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order that, from and after the date hereof, the following regulations shall be in force in the said Spalding Union, namely,—

ARTICLE I.—Tobacco or snuff may be allowed to such of the inmates of any Workhouse of the Union who are not able-bodied, or are employed upon work of a specially disagreeable character, as the Guardians may consider should be supplied with the same, the quantity to be allowed in each case, or in any class of cases, to be such as the Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

Guardians may by resolution prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—So much of Article 121 of the said General Order as provides that no pauper shall smoke in any room in the Workhouse without the special direction of the Medical Officer shall be rescinded, as regards the said Union; but the Guardians may from time to time, by resolution, determine in what rooms and at what times smoking shall be allowed, and no pauper shall smoke in the Workhouse in any other room or at any other time than is so allowed.

TASMANIA-NORTH COAST.

#### (1.) Fixed Light on Table Cape.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 74, of 14th March, 1888, on the intended exhibition of a light from a lighthouse then in course of construction on Table Cape, north coast of Tasmania:

The Government of Tasmania has given further notice, that on 1st August, 1888, the light will

be exhibited:

The light will be a fixed white light, visible seaward between the bearings of S. 61° E. and N. 66° W.; it will be elevated 390 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 27 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric, or

by lenses, of the second order.

The lighthouse, 50 feet high, is constructed of red bricks.
