Certificate of the Board of Trade for the Construc-

tion of a Deviation Railway.

WHEREAS the Nottingham Suburban Railway Company incorporated by the Nottingham Suburban Railway Act, 1886, as promoters, and for the purpose of constructing the deviation railway hereinafter described, have contracted to purchase the lands required for such deviation railway and works in connection therewith, and have complied with the requirements of the Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864, and the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do, by this their Certificate, in pursuance of the said Acts, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, certify as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited as the "Nottingham Suburban Railway (Deviation) Certificate, 1888.

Interpretation.

2. In this Certificate the expression "the Company" means the Nottingham Suburban Railway Company, and the expression "the Act of 1886" means the Nottingham Suburban Railway Act, 1886.

Power to construct Deviation Railway.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Certificate the Company may on the lands contracted to be purchased by them as aforesaid, make and maintain the deviation railway, shown on the amended plans and sections, signed by Courtenay Boyle, Assistant Secretary (Railway Department), Board of Trade, and deposited in respect of the application for this Certificate in the lines and according to the levels shown on such plans and sections, with all proper stations, sidings, approaches, works, and conveniences connected therewith:

The deviation railway authorized in this certificate will be situate wholly in the parish of Sneinton, in the town and county of the town of Nottingham, and commence by junctions with the up and down lines of the Nottingham and Grantham Line of the Great Northern Railway, at points respectively three chains or thereabouts in an easterly direction and cight chains or thereabouts in a westerly direction measured along that line from the centre of the bridge carrying the said Nottingham and Grantham Line over Trentlane, and terminating by a junction with Railway No. 1 authorized by the Nottingham Suburban Railway Act, 1886, at a point three chains or thereabouts measured in a southerly direction along that railway from the road, numbered on the deposited plans referred to in the Act of 1886, 34 in the parish of Sneinton, at the point where that railway crosses such road.

Time for Completion.

4. If the deviation railway is not completed within three years from the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, then, on the expiration of that period, the powers by this Certificate granted to the Company for making and completing the same, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall cease to be exercised except as to so much thereof as is then completed.

Tolls.

5. The deviation railway by this Certificate anthorized shall for all purposes, including the levying of tolls and charges, and the working and traific agreements authorized by the Act of 1886, be deemed to be part of the railways of the Company authorized by that Act.

Agreement with Great Northern Railway Company to apply to Deviation.

6. The provisions of the agreement between the Promoters of the Nottingham Suburban Railway Company of the one part, and the Great Northern Railway Company of the other part, scheduled to and confirmed by the Nottingham Suburban Railway Act, 1886, shall apply to the deviation railway hereby authorized in all respects as if the said deviation railway had been authorized by the Act of 1886, and had been one of the railways referred to and described in the said agreement.

Application of Funds.

Owners, &c., not to be affected by abandonment.

shall be released from all liability to purchase or to complete the purchase of any such lands, but notwithstanding full compensation shall be made by the Company to the owners and occupiers or other persons interested in such lands for all injury or damage sustained by them respectively by reason of the purchase not being completed pursuant to the contract or notice, and the amount and application of the compensation shall be determined in manner provided by the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, as amended by any subsequent Act for determining the amount and application of compensation paid for lands taken under the provisions thereof.

Provision as to General Acts.

11. Nothing in this Certificate contained shall exempt the Company or the railway from the provisions of any general Act relating to railways or the better or more impartial audit of the accounts of Railway Companies now in force, or which may hereafter pass during this or any future Session of Parliament, or from any future revision or alteration under the authority of Parliament of the maximum rates of fares and charges, or of the rates for small parcels.

Costs.

12. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the preparing for obtaining and passing of this Certificate, or otherwise in relation thereto, shall be paid by the Company.
