THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 96 of The Animals Order of 1886, do hereby license the Local Authority for the county of Perth, to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase of a certain bull the property of John Young, of Balmyle, Meigle, in the county of Perth, recently slaughtered and buried by order of the Local Authority, subject to the following conditions :—

- 1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the animal was affected with a contagious or infectious disease and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of quick lime or other disinfectant, and with not less than six feet of earth.
- 2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.
- 3. This Licence is revocable by the Privy Council. C. L. Peel.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board : Altering General Accounts Order : Appointment of Stocktaker :--

Barton-upon-Irwell Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bartonupon-Irwell Union, in the county of Lancaster ;---

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Barton-upon-Irwell Union, it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows :---

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Barton-upon-Irwell Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Union for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as We may from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or

resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians, subject to Our consent, or be removed by Us, or be proved to be insane by evidence which We may deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to Us of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.



WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, and which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eightyseven, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, both days inclu-We ascertained that the number of coins, sive. both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain; and we took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether fifteen Five Pound or One hundred shilling pieces, and six Two Pound or Forty shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule of the Coinage Act, 1870. We found that there was no variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was plus four hundred thousands (or '00004), and, therefore, that the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to We weighed the residue of the said fineness. Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue two Five Pound pieces, We then and two Two Pound pieces, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Five Pound pieces weighed respectively,—the first 616.302 grains, and the second 616.092 grains; and that such Two Pound pieces weighed respectively,-the first 246.378 grains, and the second 246.838 grains. We then assayed the said two Five Pound pieces, and the said two Two Pound pieces, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Five Pound pieces to be 916.80 and 916.86 respectively, and of such Two Pound pieces to be 916.76 and 916.70 respectively. We also took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether eleven Crowns, eighteen Double Florins, fifteen Half-Crowns, seventeen Florins, twenty-eight Shillings, fifteen Sixpences, one Fourpenny piece, five Threepenny pieces, one Twopenny piece, and one Penny piece, and weighed each of the said Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy of the said First Schedule of the said Coinage Act, 1870. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act was minus one hundreth of an ounce (or ·01) on the whole of such coins, and that, there-fore, they were within the prescribed remedy

as to Weight. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that there was no variation from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue one Crown, one Double Florin, one Half-Crown, one Florin, one Shilling, and one Sixpence, and one Threepenny piece, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Crown weighed 436.203 grains, that such Double Florin weighed 348.800 grains, that such Half-Crown weighed 217.511 grains, that such Florin weighed 174.365 grains, that such Shilling weighed 87.372 grains, that such Sixpence weighed 43.646 grains, and that such Threepenny piece weighed 21.798 grains. We then assayed the said Crown, the said Double Florin, the said Half-Crown, the said Florin, the said Shilling, the said Sixpence, and the said Threepenny piece separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Crown to be 926.4, of such Double Florin to be 925.2, of such Half-Crown to be 924.7, of such Florin to be 924.7, of such Shilling to be 925.3, of such Sixpence to be 925.0, and of such Threepenny piece to be 925.2.
