(Swine-Fever.)

T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 24th day of July, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the parish of Kenilworth, in the county of Warwick, — which was declared by Order of Council to be an Arca infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commeucement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
