

goats being or having been on board a vessel at the same time with cattle so brought.

(2.) And the animals imported shall not be landed at a Foreign Animals Wharf unless and until the master of the vessel has on each occasion of importation of foreign animals therein delivered to the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officer, a declaration made and signed that all the animals then imported therein are properly imported according to the provisions of this Article.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order of 1836.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as THE ANIMALS (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1888, No. 3.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
