

## (SWINE-FEVER.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 11th day of August, 1888.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The limits of the following Place situate at Chatteris, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, which is declared by order of the Chatteris Sub-Committee District of the Division of North Witchford, of the Local Authority of the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, dated the sixth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to be a Place infected with swine-fever (namely),—the Forty Foot river on or towards the north, the Horseway-road on the east and south, and How Fen Drove and an imaginary straight line in continuation thereof (as far as the said Forty Foot river) on the west, (which place comprehends the farms of Robert Osborne and Walter Ruston and some arable land), also the farm of Edward K. Moulton being near to the premises of the said Robert Osborne but on the eastern side of the Horseway-road aforesaid shall form part of said Infected Place, the said Horseway-road not being included as part thereof,—are hereby contracted or altered so as to include the Place as described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place so described in the Schedule to this Order shall from and after the commencement of this Order be deemed to be the Place declared by the said order of the Local Authority to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twelfth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.
