1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

An Area round Arthurs Bridge Farm, in the parish of Lamyat, in the county of Somerset, comprised within the following boundary, that is to say, from the corner of Evercreech-road through Cuttern-lane to Mr. Perry's and Mr. Welsh's Farms both wholly within the Area, thence to Lamyat crossing through land in the occupation of Mr. Norman, and thence by Brutonroad to Waddon Farm across a field called Mashstone, thence across Simsfield to Looks Orchard and Barber's field, thence by the brook to Long Hill Farm wholly within the Area, thence across Hill's fields to Owley Farm both within the Area, and thence by Evercreech-road to Cuttern-lane aforesaid.


