Foreign Office, November 1, 1858.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

An Area comprising all those lands and premises situate in the parish of Billingham, in the county of Durham, in the occupation of Mr. Thomas Robinson, Mr. William Sowerby, Mrs. George Robinson, Mr. Wooler, Mr. Heslop, Mr. William Caygill, and others, bounded on the north by Billingham Beck, on the west by the West Hartlepool and Stockton Branch of the North-Eastern Railway, on the east by the Port Clarence Branch of the said Railway, and on the south by the river Tees.
