In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867, and in the Matter of the Carina Opera Syndicate Limited.

BY an Order made by the Honourable Mr. Justice Chitty in the above matter, dated the 8th day of December, 1888, on the petition of Thomas Gardiner Hales, of 40, Wellington-street, Strand, in the county of Middlesex, Theatrical Costumier, a creditor, it was ordered that the Carina Opera Syndicate Limited be wound up by this Court under the provisions of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867.—Dated the 15th day of December, 1888.

Mr. Justice North.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867, and in the Matter of Deakin and Company Limited.

BY an Order made by the Honourable Mr. Justice North in the above matter, dated the 1st day of December, 1888, on the petition of Alfred Hunter, of No. 19, Nicholl-square, Hamsell-street, in the city of London, Feather Merchant, it was ordered that the said Deakin and Company Limited be wound up by this Court under the provisions of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867; and it was ordered that Sidney Frederick Isitt, the Provisional Official Liquidator appointed by Order, dated 23rd day of November, 1888, be continued, notwithstanding that he has not yet given security as directed by the said Order, dated 23rd November, 1888; and it is ordered that the costs of the petitioner, and of the said Company, and of Thomas Hall and Peter Joseph George and Alex. Pirie and Sons Limited, of the said petition, be taxed by the Taxing Master, and paid out of the assets of the said Company, but in such taxation only one set of costs is to be allowed to the said Thomas Hall and Peter Joseph George and Alex.
