day the Second day of Odober now next coming, with a full Purpose and Resolution to keep to that Time; And being desirous also, for Weighty Considerations, to have then a full Assembly of the Members of Parliament: Their Majesties therefore (with the Advice of their Privy-Council) have thought fit to D. clare and Publish, and do bereby declare and Publish Their said Resolution. also by this Their Proclamation do Require all and every the Peers of this Resliw, and all and every the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses of the House of Commons, to give Their Attendance account of them.

at Westminster on the said Second day of October next, precisely; Wherein Their Majesties do expect a ready Conformity to this Their Royal Will and Pleasure.

Given at our Court at Whitehall the Twelfth Day of September, 1690. In the Second Year of Our Reign.

Edinburg, September 10. The Parliament hath fat these three last days, and has given Their Majesties a new Subsidy of three Months Celle on Lands, and have laid a Tax of 1 + d, upon every Firehearth, Hospitals and such as live upon Charity only excepted. The Parliament will Sit again to morrow, to pass an Act for preventing the Robberies and Depredations of the Highlanders, and then they will be Adjourned till Winter. We have just now received an account from Major-General Mackay, that the design of Buichan and Canon in going Northward, was to have joyned the Earl of Se. forth, and the rest of the Mackenzies, and to have surprised the Garison of Inverness; But Major-General Mackay pursued them so close, that he hindred their effecting it, and obliged the Earl of Seaferth, with all his Clan and Kindred, to deliver up their Arms, and furrender themselves, who are now in the Garison of Inverness. In the mean time, the Rebels, commanded by Bouchan and Canen, marched Southward over the Hills, and are come within 18 miles of Sterlin, where the Earl of Drumlancing was posted with 3000 Foot and Horse, who has received Orders to march towards the Rebels and to attack them, and the Major-General being at the fame time in their Rear, we are expecting a very good
