4. Night signals to be shown from the inner jetties, as follows:—

When there is a "free stem" and vessels are allowed to enter the docks, a green light will be exhibited on the end of the Eastern Jetty, and a red light on the end of the Western Jetty.

When there is a "stemming list" and vessels

when there is a "stemming list" and vessels on that list only are allowed to enter, a green light will be exhibited on the end of both jetties.

Note.—As the Western Breakwater, and the permanent lighthouse thereon will not be completed in time for the proposed opening of Barry Docks in June, 1889, permission has been given for a provisional light of the same character as that sanctioned (occulting once every five seconds) being shown therefrom.
