BYE-Laws made by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department, with the consent of the Board of Trade:-

WARDEN POINT BATTERY AND HURST ARTILLERY CASTLE PRACTICE RANGES

1. Whilst gun practice is going on from Warden Point Battery or from Hurst Castle no ship, bont, barge, craft, or other vessel of any description shall, unless compelled so to do by the exigencies of navigation, be allowed to ground, anchor, or remain within the area contained by the following lines, viz.:-

From Warden Point Battery westward through the Elbow Buoy to the three-fathom patch of the

Dolphin Bank.

From the said three-fathom patch of the Dolphin Bank north by east to the shore of the

mainland opposite Taddiford Farm.

From Warden Point Battery in a north-west direction through Warden Ledge Buoy till it meets the shore of the mainland opposite Milford Church.

This area includes within it the shifting bank of shingle which is situated about fourteen cables west by north of Warden Point Battery and twelve cables south-west of Hurst Castle.

2. The signal that gun practice is going on shall be a red flag hoisted at either the Warden Point

Battery or Hurst Fort.

3. The Officer Commanding the Royal Artillery, Western Forts, or the Commandant of the Practice Camp, or any officer for the time being under their command, shall have power and is hereby authorized-

(a.) To take into custody without warrant and bring before a Court of Summary Jurisdiction, as mentioned in the Act, to be dealt with according to law, any person contravening Bye-law No. 1

aforesaid.

(b.) To remove from the area defined by Byelaw No. 1 any person, vessel, or thing found therein in con ravention of that By e-law.

4. Any person contravening Bye-law No. 1 shall be deemed to commit an offence against the same, and is under the Act liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding five pounds.

Blackpool Corporation Tramways. BYE-LAWS and REGULATIONS made by the Promoters and their Lessees.

The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Blackpool, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, acting by the Council as Promoters, and the Blackpool Electric Tramway Company Limited, as Lessees of the Tramways, under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and "The Blackpool Corporation Tramways Order, 1884," confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1884, do hereby respectively make the following Bye-laws and Regulations:—

For preventing the commission of any nuisance in or upon any carriage, or in or against any premises belonging to them.

For regulating the travelling in or upon any

carriage belonging to them.

1. The bye-laws and regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Lessees, and to all places with respect to which the Promoters and Lessees have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

Every passenger shall enter or depart from a closed carriage by the conductor's platform, and not otherwise, and every passenger shall enter or depart from an open carriage by the step or platform on the near side thereof, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage

or on either platform.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

- 5. A person in a state of intoxication, or infected with any infectious or contagious disease, shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 6. No person shall swear or use any obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, or the linings, or remove any number, plate, printed, painted, or other notice, or any advertisement in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage, or touch, handle, or interfere with any electric machine or appliance in, under, upon, or about any carriage. Any person acting in contraven-tion of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-Laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any carriage, and may be prevented from entering or remaining in or upon any carriage, and shall not enter, or be or remain in or upon any part thereof, after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in or upon any

carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Lessees the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Lessees, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the said Tramways Order, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage. The conductor may decline to take into or upon the carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in or upon the carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Lessees shall be permitted to travel on the steps of any carriage or to travel on the platform of any carriage where suitable fixed seats are not provided on such platform, or to travel on any platform occupied by the driver of any carriage whether seats shall or shall not be provided on such last-mentioned platform, or to stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, or an authorized servant of the Promoters or Lessees, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which may lawfully be conveyed thereby no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage, when warned by the conductor not to do so, and the conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond that number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

16. No person shall enter, mount, or leave or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

- 17. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in the interior of any carriage nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal is offensive or an annoyance to any passenger shall the same be allowed on the outside of any carriage. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or upon any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor or any passenger. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 18. No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument, or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

19. No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede

any officer or servant of the promoters or lessees in the execution of his duty upon or in connexion with any carriage or tramway of the promoters or lessees.

20. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations, and prevent any breach thereof to the best of his

21. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of forty shillings; provided nevertheless that the Justices or Court before whom any complaint may be made, or any proceedings may be taken in respect of any such offence, may, if they think fit, adjudge the payment as a penalty of any sum less than the full amount of the penalty imposed by these Byelaws and Regulations.

22. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the

lessees and having charge of a carriage.
23. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use and in every office and waiting-room of the Lessees a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

24. These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come

in force on the 1st day of July, 1889.
