(Application to Board of Trade, under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for Licence to Produce and Distribute Electricity; Power to Make Charges, to Acquire Lands, to Construct Works, to Make Arrangements with Local Authorities, to Open Streets, and Lay Electric Lines).

NOTICE is hereby given, that application has been made to the Board of Trade by the Southampton Electric Light and Power Company Limited, whose registered office is at 23, High-street, in the town and county of Southampton, and who are hereinafter called "the Undertakers," for a Licence, under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for the following purposes:—

To authorize the Undertakers to produce and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes, within the area of supply hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, the whole of the municipal borough of Southampton, in the county of Southampton.

To authorize the Undertakers to purchase, hold, acquire, or take on lease, any lands, or interests, or easements in lands.

To authorize the Undertakers to construct and maintain, use, and work stations, buildings, machinery, apparatus, wire, and appliances, for the purpose of producing, storing, and distributing electricity within the area of supply.

To authorise the Undertakers to open and break up the soil and pavement of the public streets and thoroughfares within the area of supply, and also the following streets, which are not repairable by the Local Authority, that is to say:—Polygon-road, Oxford-avenue, Graham-road, Exmoor-road, Clovelly-road, Mill-road, Ferry-street, River-street, Britannia-road, Victoria-street, Rochester-street, Peel-street, Guildford-street, Brookvale-road; and also the following railways and tramways, that is to say:—The London and South Western Railway, the Southampton Tramways, and the Southampton Pier and Harbour Board Tramways; and to divert or alter sewers, drains, mains, or pipes therein, and to lay down, set up, maintain, renew, or remove wires and electric lines, as defined in the Electric Lighting Acts, and all other works required for

carrying into effect the objects of the proposed undertaking.

To authorise the Undertakers to acquire and hold patent rights and licences in relation to the manufacture and distribution of electricity.

To authorise the Undertakers and the Local Authority to make and carry into effect agreements for the production and distribution of electricity, and for the performing of all acts incidental to public and private lighting.

It is proposed to place electric lines or other works, as defined in the Electric Lighting Acts, in, over, or along all or some of the public streets included in the area of supply above mentioned, and in all or some of the streets not repairable by the Local Authority set forth in this notice.
