WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the seventh day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by the thirtieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Your Majesty's reign, cap. eighty-nine, entitled the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted that the Admiralty may, with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time make free grants of land, part of the lands vested in them by virtue of this Act, ‘for the erection of buildings \* \* \* or other public purposes (so that any such grant of land do not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one parish).’

“We humbly beg leave to submit that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the free grant of a piece of ground in the town of Alston, comprising about 132½ square yards, for the improvement of the approach to the parish church and of the public thoroughfare.”

Her Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. *C. L. Peel.*

WHEREAS by the three hundred and thirty-third section of “The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854,” it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority, by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, from time to time to do within its district all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section.

And whereas the Inverness Harbour Trustees being a Pilotage Authority within the meaning of the said Act, have, in exercise of the powers

vested in them by that Act, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty Bye-laws with respect to Pilots, and Pilotage within their district and under their jurisdiction, copy of which Bye-laws is set forth in the schedule hereto annexed :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said Bye-laws are reasonable and proper :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council is pleased to approve of, and signify Her consent to, the said Bye-laws, as set forth in the schedule hereto annexed.

## SCHEDULE.

I. It is the duty of Pilots licensed by the Trustees, and they are hereby required, at all times to be on the look-out, and when a signal for a Pilot is observed from any ship or vessel going out of, or coming into, the port of Inverness, including the River Ness, to proceed with all dispatch, to take charge of such ship or vessel. And should the Master, Owner, or other person in command of a vessel requiring a Pilot, whether leaving or entering the harbour, including river, refuse to allow the Pilot first offering himself at the vessel to take charge of her as aforesaid, such Master or Owner shall be liable to the said Pilot in a penalty equal to the full Pilotage dues, besides expenses. Pilots quitting the ships or vessels of which they have charge without consent of the Master, shall forfeit their pilotage dues, and incur a penalty of not less than one pound, and not exceeding five pounds for such offence.

II. No person shall *in future* act as a Harbour Pilot (excepting always masters or mates licensed for their own vessels only), unless he has been examined, and found skilful and qualified to act as Pilot for the Harbour, and has received a Pilot's licence. Every person applying to be licensed as a Harbour Pilot must be able to read and write, and must set forth in his application his usual place of abode, his age, height, complexion, and any other circumstance or peculiarity descriptive of his person, and produce a satisfactory certificate of moral character.

III. Every boat shall have a crew of two men, or one man and two boys, besides the licensed Pilot, and when afloat shall have a flag at the mast-head; or on a sprit or staff, or in some other equally conspicuous situation; and such flag shall be of large dimensions, and of two colours—the upper half white, and the lower half red.

IV. Harbour Pilots must always be in readiness with a boat, approved of and licensed, and manned as aforesaid, and must take charge of any vessel when required, and attend *exclusively* on the vessel they have charge of, and on no account whatever go to any other while so engaged, unless in cases of great necessity, bad weather, or extreme danger, and then only with the consent of the captain on whose vessel they are attending.

V. The duty of the Pilot and his assistants shall not be fully discharged until the vessel is moored where the Harbour or Dock Master may direct at the tide or time she enters.

VI. The Master of every vessel, if a Pilot is employed, shall sign and deliver to the Pilot a certificate, stating (in words) the number of feet of water which his vessel draws, and her tonnage and whether she was towed by a steamer.

VII. Pilots are required to make themselves thoroughly acquainted with the signals of the port and the Bye-laws and Regulations, and also frequently to inspect the entrance of the harbour, and the harbour itself, at low water spring tides, especially after storms or land floods; and when, through ignorance, negligence, or otherwise, they permit vessels to run aground, they will be severely punished and held responsible for damage caused to any of the harbour works, dredging plant, or other property.

VIII. The Superintendent, Harbour Master, or Dock Master has power to give directions to Pilots, and order them to take charge of any vessel when wanted; and also from time to time to inspect the boats and crews, and see that the Pilots do their duty and observe the Regulations.

IX. In case a pilot boat shall during a gale of wind be prevented from any sufficient cause from boarding any vessel having a signal for a Pilot, the Pilot shall run his boat ahead of such vessel and direct her course so far as it may be in his power, and shall be entitled for such service to the usual dues.

X. A Pilot having charge of any ship or vessel going out of or coming into the Harbour of Inverness, including the river, shall observe strict sobriety and civility; and if he shall be guilty of using improper or disrespectful language to his employers, or shall through negligence, incapacity, or in any other manner, occasion injury to the vessel of which he has charge, or to any other ship or vessel, he shall be liable in a penalty of not less than one pound nor exceeding five pounds, besides the damage occasioned by his negligence or misconduct; and for a second offence he shall be liable in the like penalties, besides forfeiting his licence.

XI. No Pilot shall be entitled to charge higher rates than those authorized under a penalty of not less than one pound nor exceeding five pounds; and in case of a second offence of the same description, he shall forfeit his licence.

XII. Any Owner, Master, or other person in charge or command of a vessel, who shall agree, or attempt to agree, with any licensed Pilot to act as Pilot on board of such vessel at lower rates of pilotage than those authorized, shall be liable in a penalty of not less than three pounds nor exceeding five pounds sterling, besides expenses, over and above the full dues of pilotage.

XIII. Any Pilot who shall, upon being applied to, and while neither engaged in performing duty as a Pilot, nor incapacitated by ill-health, refuse to take charge of any vessel, after being applied to by the party in charge of such vessel within the limits of his licence, shall be liable in a penalty of not less than ten shillings nor more than five

pounds; and further, shall be liable to instant dismissal from his office.

XIV. Should the Master of any vessel bound for the Inverness Harbour, and requiring a Pilot, be unable to procure a Licensed Pilot, and be, in consequence, obliged to commit the piloting of his vessel to a person not licensed, such Unlicensed Pilot shall, on the vessel being boarded by a Licensed Pilot, give up his charge, and be entitled to payment only of distance money, the Licensed Pilot being in such a case obliged to allow a reasonable deduction in favour of the person who previously had the charge; and should any Licensed Pilot offer to board a vessel having an Unlicensed Pilot in charge and the Master or other person in command shall refuse to allow him to go on board, the Licensed Pilot shall be entitled to recover from the said Master, Owner, or other person in charge of said vessel, the same rate of pilotage, in name of penalty, for breach of this Regulation, as if the said Licensed Pilot had been received on board on application.

XV. All complaints at the instance of Masters, Owners, or other persons in charge of vessels coming into or going out of the River and Harbour of Inverness, against Pilots, or at the instance of Pilots against the Masters or Owners of vessels, for breach of any of these Regulations, shall be lodged with the Clerks of the Harbour Trustees, who shall have power to bring the offenders or persons complained of before the judge or judges named in the Acts of Parliament relating to pilotage, to be dealt with as thereby provided.

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Your Majesty chapter seventy of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-seven of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter fifty-five and of the Act of the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-two have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mary Magdalene Wandsworth Common situate in Trinity-road in the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester.

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and of the parish of Battersea in the county and diocese aforesaid which said extremities lie contiguous one to another and are described in the schedule hereunder written there is collected together a

population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parishes respectively.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and of the parish of Battersea should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Mary Magdalene Wandsworth Common situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester as such Bishop, and with the consent of Elizabeth Du Buisson of Heathfield Wandsworth Common in the said county of Surrey Spinster as the patron for the next turn of the vicarage of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and with the consent of the said Anthony Wilson Bishop of Rochester as the patron (after the next turn) in right of his see of the vicarage of the same parish and with the consent of the Right Honourable John Peyntz Earl Spencer Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter as the patron of the vicarage of the said parish of Battersea (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly represent that it would in our opinion be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and of the parish of Battersea aforesaid which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Mary Magdalene Wandsworth Common situate as aforesaid and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene, Wandsworth Common.'

"We therefore humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary Magdalene Wandsworth Common being:—

"All that portion of the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth and also all that contiguous portion of the parish of Battersea wherein the present incumbents of those parishes still respectively possess the exclusive cure of souls both in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester which said portions are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries Trinity-road over the main line of the London and South-Western Railway and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western angle of the grounds now in the possession of the Commissioners of the Royal Patriotic Fund and their tenant and extending thence north-eastward along the wall or fence which divides the said grounds from Wandsworth Common for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth of the new parish of Saint Michael Wandsworth Common Battersea in the county and diocese aforesaid and of the parish of Battersea aforesaid all meet, and continuing thence in

the same direction that is to say still north eastward along the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Michael Wandsworth Common Battersea from the parish of Battersea aforesaid for a distance of eight and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby continuing to follow the said wall or fence) to a point in the middle of the down line of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said down line of railway for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts, thereby passing through the Wandsworth Common Station, to the boundary which divides the said parish of Battersea from the new parish of Upper Tooting in the county and diocese aforesaid and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the last described boundary for a distance of thirty-one chains or thereabouts, thereby following, in the last-mentioned direction, the course of a private lane which leads from the house called or known as the Boundaries into Saint James's-road, to the point where the same boundary bends sharply towards the south, and extending thence still south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of one chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Saint James's-road aforesaid, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Trinity-road aforesaid, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of three chains or thereabouts, to its junction with Crockerton-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last named road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts, thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said parish of Battersea from the parish of Saint Anne Wandsworth aforesaid, to the present south-western end of the same road and continuing thence still south-westward and in a direct line for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Beechcroft-road and extending thence first north-westward and then northward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Burntwood-lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts, to a point opposite to the south-western angle of the grounds attached to the house called or known as Burntwood Grange, and extending thence north-westward to and along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the last described grounds for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a point at the north-western angle of the same grounds and continuing thence still north-westward and in a direct line for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Magdalen-road where it is joined by the roadway forming the entrance to Wandsworth Cemetery and extending thence still north-westward along the middle of the last described roadway for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to a point at the entrance to the said cemetery and extending thence still north-westward along the roadway which bisects the same cemetery for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its present north-western end and extending thence still in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said main line of the London and South-Western Railway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named line of railway for a distance of thirty-two chains or thereabouts to the first described point at the centre of the

bridge which carries Trinity-road over the s line of railway at which point the said imagin line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester.

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, and published in the London Gazette on the fourth day of July following certain contiguous portions of the two cures of Saint George Camberwell and of Saint Anne Bermondsey in the said county of Surrey, and also at that time in the diocese of Winchester aforesaid, were assigned as a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Philip situate within the limits of the said cure of Saint George Camberwell and the same consolidated chapelry was called ‘The Consolidated chapelry of Saint Philip, Camberwell.’

“And whereas both the said particular district of Christ Church Camberwell and the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Philip Camberwell have each of them under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

“And whereas by another Order of Your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and published in the London Gazette on the seventeenth day of the same month certain portions of the said diocese of Winchester and certain portions of the diocese of London all of them being within the said county of Surrey were transferred to and are now part of the diocese of Rochester aforesaid and the cures hereinbefore mentioned were then transferred to and are now comprised within the limits of the last-named diocese.

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church Camberwell and of the said new parish of Saint Philip Camberwell shall be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

“Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council, ratifying this scheme or representation, and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries both of the said new parish of Christ Church Camberwell and of the said new parish of Saint Philip Camberwell shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church Camberwell which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Philip Camberwell.

“And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

“The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Christ Church Camberwell in the county of Surrey and diocese of Rochester and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Philip Camberwell in the said county and diocese, being:—

“All that portion of the said new parish of Christ Church Camberwell which is situate on the western side of Saint James's-road and is bounded upon the south-west upon the west and upon the north by the new parish of Saint Philip Camberwell aforesaid and upon the east by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Bartholomew Camberwell in the county and diocese aforesaid.”

The Governing Body of the House at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose on Wednesday 8 May 1889, did nemine contradicente by Statute add at the end of Statute XXIII the following new clause.

*These Exhibitioners shall not be eligible for House Scholarships; but the Governing Body may, if they think fit to do so, bestow on any such Exhibitioner the rights and privileges of a Scholar without the emoluments, continuing to him the full emoluments of his Exhibition.*

Christ Church Statute XXIII as altered by the Governing Body on 8 May 1889, by addition of the words in italics.

#### STATUTE XXIII.

The Exhibitions of the Foundations of Archbishop Boulter for Servitors, Mr. Pouncefoot, Dr. Gardiner, Bishop Frampton, Dr. Cotton, and Mrs. Paul, shall be applied to the support of College Exhibitioners, who shall be elected after examination in such subjects and such manner as the Governing Body shall determine. If and so far as these funds are insufficient, the support of these Exhibitioners shall be charged on the general revenues of the House. Notice of each election shall be given in the same manner as that prescribed above for the election of Open Scholars, and the Exhibitioners shall be elected at first for two years only, the tenure of these Exhibitions being renewable in the same manner as that allowed for Scholarships, and on the same terms. No person shall be appointed to one of these Exhibitions, unless he shall give sufficient proof to the Dean of his need of such assistance to enable him to obtain the benefit of a University education.

THE following Statute, passed on the twenty-ninth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, by the Governing Body of the House of Christ Church, Oxford, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

The Governing Body of the House at a meeting specially summoned for the purpose under Statute XXXII on Wednesday, twenty-ninth May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, did nemine contradicente by Statute add in Statute I paragraph 3, after the words "Treasurer or Steward" these words:—*or who is appointed to discharge the duties of Treasurer or Steward during the incapacity, for a longer or shorter period of either of those officers.*

Christ Church Statute I as altered by the Governing Body on twenty-ninth May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, by addition of the words in italics.

#### STATUTE I.

The Government of the Foundation and the disposal and management of its possessions and revenues, including all estates formerly vested in the Dean and Chapter, or in the Dean and Canons, or in the Dean and certain of the Canons, upon any trust for purposes connected with the House, shall be vested in the Dean, Canons, Students, (except as hereinafter provided), and such other persons as under the provisions of the Statutes may be made members of the Governing Body; and all powers and authorities whatsoever formerly exercised by the Dean and Canons alone, or by the Dean and Canons conjointly with any other person or persons within the House, shall be exercised by the Dean Canons and the said Students and the other persons above-mentioned, as the Governing Body of the House; except only the powers and authorities, which, by the parts hereby left unrepealed and still in force of the ordinance contained in the Schedule to the "Christ Church, Oxford, Act, 1867," are expressly reserved to the Dean and Canons; and the Dean and Canons shall not, on their part, otherwise than as individual members of the Governing Body, be entitled to control or interfere with the exercise of the powers hereby assigned to the Governing Body.

Students of the House elected before the day on which the Commissioners' Ordinance of the ninth day of January, 1858, was approved by Her Majesty in Council shall, if resident in the University, or holding any office within the House, be entitled to act as members of the Governing Body. Those only shall for this purpose be considered resident in the University who shall, at the time when the privilege of residence is claimed or exercised, be qualified as residents to vote in the Congregation of the University under the Act 17th and 18th Victoria, chapter 81.

The House shall have power to elect as a member of the Governing Body any professor endowed wholly or in part from the funds of the House, or any person who is serving the House in the capacity of Treasurer or Steward *or who is appointed to discharge the duties of Treasurer or Steward during the incapacity for a longer or shorter period, of either of those officers.* Such

persons, if elected to the Governing Body, shall be Students of the House, and shall take rank as to seniority with the Official Students, except that they shall receive no emolument as Students, and shall not be subject to the provisions of these Statutes as to educational duties, and on vacating office shall cease to be members of the Governing Body.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 17th December, 1885, soon after 5.30 A.M., as the "Ennerdale" was rounding Cape Horn, an apprentice, named Duncan McCallum, fell from aloft into the sea, striking the rigging in his fall.

HARRY S. POCHIN, an A.B., immediately leapt overboard after him, but McCallum sank before he could reach him. The water was intensely cold, and POCHIN was seized with cramp, and was on the point of sinking, when he was reached and kept afloat by Mr. Whistler, first mate of the vessel, who jumped overboard to his assistance.

Considerable delay occurred in launching a boat from the vessel, and both men were forty minutes in the water, and were thoroughly exhausted before they were picked up, and became quite insensible on being lifted into the boat.

A huge albatross, which had hovered round the two men preparing to attack them, had to be driven off with a boat-hook.
