UNITED STATES—LONG ISLAND SOUND.

(1.) *Fog Signal at Great Captain Island Lighthouse.*

THE United States Government has given notice, that on or about 20th July, 1889, a fog signal would be established at Great Captain Island Lighthouse, Long Island Sound:—

The signal is a 10-inch steam whistle, which, during thick or foggy weather, will give blasts of three seconds duration, at intervals of twenty-seven seconds.

Position, lat. 40° 59' N., long. 73° 37½' W.

(2.) *Port Ste. Marie—Harbour Lights.*
