

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 306 of the year 1889.)

BORNEO—NORTH-EAST COAST.

(1.) Shoals Eastward of Marchesa Bay:

THE following information concerning certain shoals eastward of Marchesa Bay, north-east coast of Borneo, the result of a recent examination of the locality, has been received from Captain Honourable F. C. P. Vereker, Her Majesty's surveying ship "Rambler":—

(1.) A shoal, with a depth of $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, and 9 to 22 fathoms around, is situated with Lankayan Island bearing S. by E. E'ly, distant $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Leonan W. $\frac{3}{8}$ N.

Position, lat. $6^{\circ} 42' 45''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 53' 15''$ E.

(2.) A shoal, with a depth of 3 fathoms, and 9 to $2\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms around, is situated with Lankayan Island bearing S. by E., distant 9 miles, and Billean W. by S. $\frac{7}{8}$ S. Shoals with depths of $6\frac{1}{2}$, 3, and $3\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, and 13 to $2\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms around, lie respectively N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles; W.S.W., $1\frac{1}{10}$ miles; and S.E. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, from this shoal.

Position, 3 fathoms, lat. $6^{\circ} 39' 30''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 53' 55''$ E. Position, $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, lat. $6^{\circ} 40' 25''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 52' 45''$ E. Position, 3 fathoms, lat. $6^{\circ} 39' 0''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 52' 55''$ E. Position, $3\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, lat. $6^{\circ} 38' 20''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 56' 5''$ E.

(3.) A rock, with less than 6 feet on it, and $4\frac{1}{4}$ to 7 fathoms to seaward, is situated eastward of the entrance to Paitan River, with Leonan bearing N. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., distant 6 miles, and Billean E. $\frac{3}{8}$ S. A reef, dry at low water, lies $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles S.E. by S. from this rock; and three similar reefs trend south-westward for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the rock.

Position, rock, lat. $6^{\circ} 38' 15''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 37' 5''$ E.

(4.) A reef, dry at low water, and half a mile in extent, with a depth of $1\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms nearly half a mile to the northward of its northern end, and 8 to 14 fathoms around, is situated with Lankayan bearing E. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., distant $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from its southern end, and Billean N.W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N.

Position, south end of reef, lat. $6^{\circ} 30' 0''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 50' 45''$ E.

(5.) Two shoals, with depths of $1\frac{1}{2}$ and $1\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, 8 to 10 fathoms around, and bearing north and south distant half a mile from each other, lie south-westward of Lankayan. From the northern of these shoals Lankayan bears N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., distant $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles, and Cay N.N.W.

Position, northern shoal, lat. $6^{\circ} 25' 30''$ N., long. $117^{\circ} 50' 55''$ E.

(6.) Shoal ground, with depths of $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 fathoms, and 12 to 13 fathoms around, extends W.S.W. $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles from Lankayan.

EASTERN ARCHIPELAGO.—FLORES ISLAND—
NORTH COAST.

(2.) Extension of Reef Westward of Longso Island.

The Government of Batavia has given notice, dated 4th July, 1889, that the Commander of H.N.M.S. "Satelliet" reports that the reef westward of Longso Island, northern coast of Flores Island, extends nearly 4 miles westward from the western point of that island:—

Depths of 3 and 4 fathoms were obtained, and discoloured water was seen, in a position with Coconut Island bearing S. 27° E., distant 2 miles; and northern side of Longso Island, N. 88° E.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation 2° Easterly in 1889.]
