To The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty.

WE, the inhabitants of the County of Merioneth, desire thus collectively to welcome Your Majesty on the joyful occasion of Your visit to us.

Our county is one of peculiar interest, as being the most Celtic of all the counties in the Principality, possessing, perhaps, more than any other, ancient records, customs, and traditions, many of which especially mark the veneration paid in early days by the people to their native Princes.
