*Foreign Office, September 30, 1889.*

IT is hereby notified, that the Marquis of Salisbury, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has, to-day, received a Telegram from Mr. Portal, Her Majesty's Acting Agent and Consul-General in Zanzibar, stating that a Proclamation has been issued, declaring that the Blockade of the Continental Coast of the Sultan of Zanzibar, including the Islands of Mafia and Lamu, and the lesser Islands, adjoining the coast, from 2° 10' South latitude to 10° 28' South latitude, which was proclaimed on the 29th of November last, is annulled from noon, the 1st of October.

The Senior German Naval Officer, who has joined in this Declaration, has added a rider thereto, stating that, notwithstanding this Proclamation, the importation of munitions of war into the German sphere is still prohibited.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—a certain field at Cruicks Farm, Cruickness, in the parish of Inverkeithing, in the county of Fife, in which field certain cattle the property of William Moyes, dairyman, of Inverkeithing are at present grazing, —which was declared by Order of the Privy Council dated the fifteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and

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that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of the Privy Council dated the twenty-sixth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely),—in the county of Fife, comprising the whole Farm of Dalginch, in the parishes of Kennoway and Markinch, in the occupation of David Normand, and the whole Farm of Newton, in the parish of Markinch, in the occupation of William R. Mitchell,—is, except such portion thereof as is included in the Area described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. The following Area (namely),—in the county of Fife, comprising the whole Farm of Dalginch, in the parishes of Kennoway and Markinch, in the occupation of David Normand,—shall continue to be and is hereby declared to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879: Assignment of Duties and District:—

Somersetshire and Dorsetshire Audit District.

To William Dewse Easterby, of No. 22, Herndon, Yeovil, in the county of Somerset, District Auditor;—

To the Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order;—

To the Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised within the said Unions respectively;—

To the Highway Boards for the Highway

Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order ;—

To the Authorities referred to in Article I. (4) of this Order ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act ;

And whereas the said William Dewse Easterby is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf :

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said William Dewse Easterby accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :—

ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers ; namely,—

- (1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order.
- (2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
- (3.) The Highway Boards for the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- (4.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are, for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions.
- (5.) Such of the other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.

ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.

ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said William Dewse Easterby shall act as Auditor, and which We hereby assign to him for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, and which shall be termed "The Somersetshire and Dorsetshire Audit District," shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions and Districts named in the Schedule to this Order, and the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in Paragraph (5) of Article I. of this Order.

ARTICLE IV.—In this Order—

The term "Parish" includes any place for which a separate Poor Rate is or can be made or for which a separate Overseer is or can be appointed.

The term "Overseers of the Poor" includes Churchwardens and Assistant Overseers.

*Storm Signals at Havana.*

THE Harbour Authorities at Havana have given notice, dated 2nd August, 1889, that during the hurricane season, the following storm signals will be made successively, from the office of the Captain of the Port, and repeated by semaphore from the Morro:—

Triangular red flag: Indications of bad weather.  
Yellow and blue flag horizontally divided: Indications increase.

Black ball: Port is closed.

Black ball over triangular red flag: Indications diminish.

Black ball over yellow and blue flag, horizontally divided: Weather clearing.

NOTE.—Vessels lying at the Moles should send down light spars and strengthen their moorings as soon as the signal, "Indications of bad weather," is made.

GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE.—CHALEUR BAY—RISTIGOUCHE RIVER.

(1.) *Oak Point—Leading Lights Discontinued.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that on 1st November, 1889, the leading lights on Oak Point, northern shore of Ristigouche River, will be discontinued, being no longer of use.

(2.) *Dipper Harbour Light—Alteration in Colour.*

The light is a fixed red light. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of small size.

GULF OF MEXICO.—MISSISSIPPI SOUND.

(3.) *Leading Lights at Pascagoula River Entrance.*

The United States Government has given notice, that on or about 21st September, 1889, two leading lights would be exhibited from beacons recently erected on the prolongation of the axis of the long arm of the dredged channel, Pascagoula River Entrance, northern shore of Mississippi Sound:—

The lights are fixed white lights, elevated respectively 27 (rear) and 21 feet above high water.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses.

The rear beacon, situated with East Pascagoula Lighthouse bearing N.N.E. distant about 483 yards, consists of a triangular pyramidal wooden framework on a foundation of three iron cased piles, all painted black.

The front beacon, situated about 333 yards S.E. from the rear beacon, is similar to it in every respect except height.

Position, lat. 30° 20' 40" N., long. 88° 34' 5" W.
