THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in

this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The limits of the following Places which are declared by order of the Sub-Executive Committee for the Elloe Division of the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, dated the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be Places infected with swine-fever (namely),—(1.) the top piggeries at the Plough Farm of Mr. George Freir at Deeping St. Nicholas, including the stack-yard and two grass fields contiguous, and (2.) the bottom piggeries at the Plough Farm of the said George Freir at Deeping St. Nicholas, including the nineteen acres ground adjoining and the field at each end of the same surrounding,—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

1. Newport (Monmouthshire) Corporation Act, 1889.
Borough of Newport (Mon.).

WHEREAS by the Newport (Monmouthshire) Corporation Act, 1889, it was provided that the extended borough should be divided into five Wards, with such names or distinguishing numbers and boundaries as should be fixed and determined by a Scheme to be made by a Commissioner to be for that purpose appointed by Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, within three weeks after the passing of the said Act.

And whereas it was further provided by the said Act that after the boundaries of the Wards of the extended borough had been fixed and determined as aforesaid, the number of the Aldermen and Councillors should be ten Aldermen and thirty Councillors, and the six additional Councillors should be elected on the 1st day of November, 1889, being the ordinary day of elections of Councillors, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts, in addition to the Councillors to be elected in place of those whose term of office expires on that day, and the two additional Aldermen should be elected by the Council, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts, on the 9th day of November, 1889, immediately after the election of the Mayor.

And whereas the said Commissioner was by the said Act further empowered to do by his scheme the following things, namely:—

(1.) Apportion all the existing Councillors among the Wards of the borough as altered, so as to provide (as far as practicable) for each of such Councillors continuing to represent as large a number as possible of his former constituents, and every such Councillor shall hold his office in the Ward to which he shall be so assigned for the same period as he would have held such office if the Wards of the existing borough had remained unaltered.

(2.) Prescribe for which of the Wards any of the additional Councillors shall be elected, and

make all necessary provision for the election, going out of office, and rotation of such Councillors, and of the two additional Aldermen.

(3.) State for which of the Wards of the borough as altered the four Aldermen assigned by the Council as Returning Officers shall act, and also name an Alderman to act as Returning Officer for the remaining Ward.

And whereas by the sixth section of the said Act it was provided that, for the purposes of the division of the extended borough into Wards and certain other proceedings therein-mentioned, the said Act should come into operation on its passing.

And whereas on the 12th day of August, 1889, the said Act received the Royal Assent, and passed into law.

And whereas on the 19th day of August, 1889, the Right Honourable Henry Matthews, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, did duly warrant and appoint Archild Bence Bence-Jones, Esq., Barrister-at-Law, to be such Commissioner for the purposes of the said Act, and furthermore did, upon the 26th day of the said month of August, in exercise of the powers given him by the sixteenth section of the said Act, fix the 16th day of September, 1889, as the day before which the scheme to be made by the Commissioner should be completed.

Now I, the said Archibald Bence Bence-Jones, do hereby, in pursuance of the said Warrant and Appointment, fix and determine that the names of the said five Wards shall respectively be as follows, namely:—North Ward, South Ward, Central Ward, East Ward, Maindee Ward.

And I do hereby fix and determine that the said North Ward shall comprise the whole of the heretofore existing North Ward as determined by the "The Newport (Monmouthshire) Improvement Act, 1876," with so much of the parish of St. Woollos as is included within the boundary line of the extended borough on the west side thereof. And I do hereby further fix and determine that the said South Ward shall comprise the whole of the heretofore existing South Ward as determined by the "The Newport (Monmouthshire) Improvement Act, 1876." And I do hereby further fix and determine that the said Central Ward shall comprise the whole of the heretofore existing Central Ward as determined by "The Newport (Monmouthshire) Improvement Act, 1876." And I do hereby further fix and determine that the said East Ward shall comprise so much of the heretofore existing East Ward as determined by "The Newport (Monmouthshire) Improvement Act, 1876," as lies to the westward of the centre of the River Usk, together with so much of the extended borough as is contained within an imaginary line commencing at a point in the centre of Newport Bridge and following the centre of the course of the River Usk northwards to a point at which the boundaries of the parishes of Malpas, St. Woollos, and Christchurch meet in the River Usk, thence following the boundary line of the extended borough to the point at which the said boundary line meets the northern side of the Christchurch-road, thence to the nearest point in the centre of the said road, and thence westwards along the centre of the said Christchurch-road to Duckpool-road, thence along the centre of Duckpool-road to Chepstow-road, along the centre of Chepstow-road and Clarence-place to the centre of Newport Bridge to the point at which the said imaginary line commenced.
