

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Declaration described in the Schedule to this Order, made by the Local Authority acting in and for the burgh of Perth, declaring the existence of pleuro-pneumonia at the place therein mentioned, is hereby on the application of the said Local Authority cancelled, and the Infected Place thereby declared shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

An Area comprising the parishes of Ramsey, and Ramsey St. Mary; in the county of Huntingdon.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke the Order of the Privy Council bearing date the twenty-eighth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eightynine, defining a part of the Port of Liverpool as a foreign animals wharf: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.
