

(PORT OF LIVERPOOL—DEFINITION OF WALLASEY FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF.)

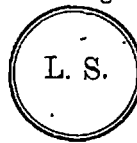
By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Liverpool as a foreign animals wharf:

All those spaces at the Wallasey Dock, in the borough of Birkenhead, and the township of Pooton-cum-Seacombe, in the county of Chester, situate on the east and the north sides of the said Dock, namely,—All that space bounded by a line commencing on the Wallasey landing-stage at a point seventy-eight feet or thereabouts from the south-east corner of the said stage, thence running in a westwardly direction thirty-six feet or thereabouts, thence in an angular direction northwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly two hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts along the south side of the north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence running in a straight line northwardly six hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts, thence north-westwardly seventy-five feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly one hundred and ninety-nine feet or thereabouts, thence southwardly fifty-four feet or thereabouts to a point in the northern face of the eastern block of warehouses on the north side of the said dock, thence westwardly ten feet or thereabouts along the said northern face, thence northwardly fifty-four feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly three hundred and forty feet or thereabouts, thence southwardly fifty-four feet or thereabouts to a point in the northern face of the western block of warehouses on the north side of the said dock, thence westwardly ten feet or thereabouts along the said northern face of the western block of warehouses, thence northwardly sixty feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly fifty-six feet or thereabouts to the south-west corner of certain cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence northwardly three hundred and thirty-seven feet or thereabouts along the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises to the north-west corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence in an eastwardly and southwardly direction for a distance of five hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly for a distance of forty-nine feet or thereabouts to the north-east corner of the said cattle-pens, slaughter-houses and premises, thence southwardly for a distance of nine hundred feet or thereabouts to or near the top of the said north bridge to the said stage, thence eastwardly two hundred and ten feet or thereabouts along the north side of the said north bridge connecting the said landing-stage with the river wall, thence eastwardly in an angular direction on the said landing-stage for a length of ninety-five feet or thereabouts, and thence southwardly along the eastern face of the said landing-stage for a length of two hundred and sixty-two feet or thereabouts to the point of commencement aforesaid near the south-east corner of the said landing-stage; and also All that space bounded by a line commencing at the north-east corner of the eastern block of warehouses on the north side of the said dock and running in a straight line along the eastern face of the said eastern block of warehouses to the coping of the north wall of the said dock a distance of eighty-seven feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly six hundred and fifty-two feet or thereabouts along

the said coping to a point in a straight line with the western face of the said western block of warehouses on the north side of the said dock, thence northwardly eighty-seven feet or thereabouts in a straight line with the said western face, thence eastwardly six hundred and fifty-two feet or thereabouts in a straight line with the northern faces of the said blocks of warehouses to the point of commencement aforesaid at the north-east corner of the said eastern block of warehouses; all which spaces are coloured pink on the plan of part of the borough of Birkenhead and township of Pooton-cum-Seacombe deposited for the purposes of this Order at the office of the Board of Agriculture, copies of which are deposited at the offices of the Town Clerk for the borough of Birkenhead, and the Clerk of the County Council for the county of Chester.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Monday, the 28th instant, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £2,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 2nd November, 1889, and will be payable at three months, or six months, or twelve months after date, at the option of the persons tendering, viz.:—on the 2nd February, or 2nd May, or 2nd November, 1890, respectively.

3. *The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.*

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Tuesday, the 29th instant, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than two o'clock, on Saturday, the 2nd proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.
