24. These bye-laws and regulations shall come into force on the 31st day of December, 1889.

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that no such bye-laws shall take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Trade, who are thereby empowered within two calendar months, after a true copy of such bye-laws shall have been laid before the Board, to allow or disallow the same as they may think proper, nor unless a true copy of such bye-laws has been delivered to the local authority of the borough of Bradford, being the promoters of part of such tramways, and to such other local authorities through whose district such tramways run, nor unless, within one month after the making of such bye-laws, a notice of the making of such bye-laws and a copy of the same shall have been published once at least in each of two successive weeks in some one and the same newspaper circulating within the district to which such bye-laws relate, and once at least in the London Gazette.

Notice is therefore hereby given, that it is intended so to submit the said bye-laws and regulations to the Board of Trade and to the said local authorities, and to apply to the Board of Trade for confirmation of same on the 31st day of December next.
