NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the provisions of the twenty-first section of an Act passed in the thirty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "The Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874," I, Sir Brydges Powell Henniker, Bart., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, have, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, ordered and declared that on and after the 1st day of January next, the Sub-Districts of the Ipswich District shall be re-arranged into two Sub-Districts for registration purposes, viz.:— The "Western" Sub-District, comprising the parishes of Ipswich St. Mary, St. Peter, St. Nicholas, St. Mary-at-Elms, St. Matthew, Whitton-with-Thurlston, St. Mary-in-the-Tower, St.
