THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and with reference especially to Article 19 of The Rabies Order of 1887, do hereby license the Local Authority for the Western Division of the county of Sussex to dig up or cause to be dug up, within fourteen days after the date of this Licence, the carcase of a certain dog buried on or about the first day of November instant at Arundel, in the Western Division of the county of Sussex, subject to the following conditions:—

1. When dug up the Local Authority shall forthwith cause the carcase to be examined with a view to ascertain whether the dog was affected with true rabies, and the Local Authority shall then cause the carcase to be re-buried as soon as possible, and shall cause it to be covered with a sufficient quantity of

quick lime or other disinfectant.

2. The expenses of and incidental to the digging up, examination, and re-burial of the carcase shall be defrayed by the Local Authority.

3. This Licence is revocable by the Board

of Agriculture.

(1.) The amount of the annual salary attainable, within the meaning of this notice, will be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners and the Head of the Department subject to reference, in doubtful cases, to the Lords of the Treasury.

(2.) When any person holding a situation in any Department is presented to the Civil Service Commissioners with a view to his appointment to some other situation in the same department, he will not be required to pay any greater fee than I
