MALTA AND FRANCE AND PLACES
viâ FRANCE.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this Warrant the expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post between Malta and France and any country or place, viâ France, to which the French Post Office may forward Parcels.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant from Malta to France not exceeding seven pounds in weight there shall be charged and paid in Malta a postage of one shilling and five pence halfpenny.

4. On all Parcels transmitted by Post under this Warrant from Malta to any country or place, viâ France, not exceeding seven pounds in weight, there shall be charged and paid in Malta a postage of one shilling and five pence halfpenny, in addition to the postage (less the sum of five pence) for the time being payable in France on like Parcels posted in France addressed to the country or place to which the said Parcels shall be addressed.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

5. No Parcel the dimensions of which shall exceed in length two feet or in length and girth combined four feet, or which shall exceed in weight seven pounds, shall be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant.

Prepayment.

6. The Postage chargeable under this Warrant shall in all cases be prepaid at the time of posting.

Mode of Posting.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant all Parcels shall in Malta be posted, forwarded, conveyed, and delivered under and subject to all such regulations, conditions, and restrictions as the Post Office Authorities in Malta, with the approval of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General, may from time to time prescribe.

Commencement of Warrant.

8. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definition.

1. In this Warrant:—

- (1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same.
- (2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and the Orange Free State.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all Parcels transmitted by Post, under this Warrant, from the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postage, that is to say:—

On every Parcel not exceeding one pound in weight, one shilling and threepence.

On every Parcel exceeding one pound and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, for the first pound one shilling and threepence, and for every additional pound or fraction of a pound in weight, one shilling and threepence.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by Post under this Warrant any Parcel the dimensions of which shall exceed in length three feet six inches, or in length and girth measured together six feet (such girth being measured round the thickest part of such Parcel), or which shall exceed in weight seven pounds.

Prepayment.

5. The postage chargeable according to the respective rates hereinbefore mentioned, shall in all cases (except as otherwise provided in this Warrant) be prepaid at the time of posting, and such prepayment shall, in the United Kingdom, be effected by means of adhesive postage stamps, or at such Post Offices, within such hours, and under and subject to such regulations, as the Postmaster-General shall from time to time prescribe, in money.

Times of Posting.

6. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post may, in the United Kingdom, be posted on any
