*Edenborough, May 7.*

**T**His place, as also all other parts of *Scotland*, continue in a quiet and peaceable Posture, for these two dayes past the Council has been sitting, and have taken so great care for the Regulation of all Counties, by placing able Officers in each of them; that the peace of the whole Nation will be for the future well secured, and a very considerable force be in readines upon all Emergencies.

This day the Council ordered, the last Sentence against *Peter Roy* and one *Dermond*, with two other their Associates, to be put into execution on Wednesday next; being all of them notorious Robbers and Murderers in the *High-Lands*.

*Weymouth, May 9.* The 7th instant arrived here the *Palm-tree* of this Port from *Cadix*, whence she departed the 2d past in company of 10 sail of Merchant ships bound for several Ports of *England*.

Several ships lately arriving from *Croisick* in *France* inform us that Monsieur *de Beaufort* having refitted his Squadron, put out again to sea from *Brest* the 25th past with 13 men of War intending to cruize towards the *Channell*.

*Hull, May 10.* The uncertainty of the weather has for a time obstructed the passage to and fro of our Merchants ships. On Wednesday last arrived here two Danish ships laden with Deals, and yesterday a Vessel of this place from *Holland*, bringing with her the men which belonged to the *Hopeful Trial* of this place, which was lately cast away near the *Tenell*.

*Lisbonne, April 22.* Since the Consummation of the Marriage of the Prince Royal with the Queen, they have hitherto continued at *Alcantara*, but on Wednesday next are expected at *Lisbonne*. The King still continues where he was, nor is there any discourse of his removal. The Marquis *de Mariatva*, who is now honoured with the Title of Duke, is also nominated Ambassador for *Madrid*, and the Count *de Pyato* for *Rome*; but the time for their departure not yet prefixed. The Count *de Lische* is as yet at *Eivas*, where he is designed to continue till all places be mutually restored, according to the Articles lately concluded between this Crown and that of *Spain*, and may afterwards return to *Castile*.

The Cortes or Parliament is still sitting, having as yet only resolved to take off all Taxes, allowing only 250000 *Cruzado's* a year, for the payment of six thousand foot, which are to be constantly entertained as a Guard upon the Frontiers.

*Rome, April 28.* On Saturday last in the Evening returned hither from his Countrey of *Siena* the Cardinal *Flavio Chigy*, who has since made his Visits to the Cardinal Patron, with the Cardinals of *Medicis* and the *Landgrave*.

The Tuesday following the Colledge of the Jesuits gave an excellent Entertainment to the Cardinal *Rospigliosi*, and several others of the Popes Relations; having in Complement to His Holiness, adorned their Colledge with several Statues and Figures of divers famous Persons, Popes, and Emperours, with many Inscriptions, to the honour of the present Pope; concluding the Treat with excellent Compositions of Musick, and several Mathematical Experiments exhibited by that excellent person Father *Athanasius Kircher*.

The Ambassadors from the Emperour, His Most Christian Majesty, and the Republick of *Venice*, have frequent Audiences from the Pope. Here is also arrived an Amba-

assador from the Republick of *Ragusa*, to beg assistance from the Pope towards the re-edifying of their City; which was the last year wholly ruined by a terrible Earthquake.

*Venice, May 1.* The Convoy intended for the re-inforcement of the *Armada*, and the strengthening the City of *Candia*, having taken aboard them their souldiers at *Lido*; with their Officers lately entertained in the service of this Republick, and the sum of 200000 Crowns in ready money; is lately sailed with a fair wind, and 'tis hoped may in few dayes reach the rest of our Fleet; the Convoy being commanded by Signior *Castarri Cornaro*, and with him is gone Monsieur *Montbrun*, intending with the first conveniency to put himself into *Candia*.

By the way of *Otranto* we have intelligence, that the *Bassa of Morca*, upon several repeated instances from the Grand Visier, had gotten together twelve great Saichs at *Napoli di Matualia*, on which he had embarked a considerable number of souldiers, with all sorts of Provisions and Ammunition for the supply of his Army; intending to take the advantage of the Night to transport them to *Canea*; but that Captain *Molino* having intelligence of their intentions, was with his Squadron and two other Privateers of *Maltha*, attending their motion; and that they had already began in two divisions to ataque them with their Cannon, in such a place, that the Turks having not the conveniency of saving themselves by flight, were forced to submit, of which we expect farther advice.

By the way of *Legorn* we are also advised, that our Captain General having spent some time, since the late and great defeat of the *Beller Gallies*; in re-fitting his ships, and repairing the damage they had received in that encounter; had fresh intelligence brought him, that 30 of the *Ottoman Gallies* with two *Galeasses*, were put out from the *Dardanelles*, intending for *Canea*; whereupon he immediately put out to sea in search of them, and at some little distance from the Isle of *Scios* discovered and engaged them; and after a sharp dispute gave them chase, sinking some and taking others; the farther account whereof, with the particulars, we may shortly expect.

We are also advised from *Dalmatia* that several Corsaires of *Dulcigno* are abroad at sea, and have made prize of several Fishermen which they seized upon the Coasts.

Other advices from *Candia*, tell us that the Turks since the late defeat of their Gallies, and the successful sally made upon them by the Marquis *Ville*, have been much discouraged; and the Grand Visier since resolved to make no farther progresse in the siege, till the arrival of his expected succors; the Grand Seignior intending to employ the force of his Empire in that service: and the Captain *Bassa* having a Fleet of 54 Gallies in readines for their transportation.

They further tell us that the Turks have endeavoured what they were able to annoy the Port of *Candia* with their Cannon, but such care has been taken by the Defendants to secure it, that their ships daily pass in and out without any inconveniency.

The Corsaires of *Algiers* and other parts of *Barbary*, having been commanded by the Grand Seignior to assist him with what ships they are able to send him, are sitting out with all diligence for that service.

*Genova, May 2.* The 30th past arrived here the *Martina* of *Bristol* from *Cadix* in 21 dayes, having left the *Saphire*, and another Fregate belonging to His Majesty of *Great Britain*, passing into *Tangier*.

Signior *Borromeo* Nuncio from His Holiness, having

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been much satisfied with his Reception in this City, went hence the last week on his way towards *Spain*, attended by one of the Gallies belonging to this Republick; uncertain as yet whether he shall land at *Barcelona*, or some other Port of *Spain*.

From *Milan* we are told that the new Governour *de los Balbaces* was daily in consultation with the principal Ministers of that State about the affairs of his Government, for the advantage of the interest of his Master the King of *Spain*: that he had by a publique Edict confirmed all the Establishments and Rules made by his Predecessor, and particularly what he had done in reference to the Church: and that he had commanded all Officers to attend their Commands, and had given out his Orders for a general Muster sometime the next Month, intending to take a view of all his forces both of Horse and Foot.

From *Turin* we are told that several Companies are already march'd for the reinforcement of the Garrisons in *Pignerolle*, and that a considerable summe of Money was advanced for the perfecting of the Fortifications there; and that the Duke of *Savoy* was resolv'd in person to go privately to *Vercelli* to encourage the Fortification of that place, and to take a view of the forces which are there in Garrison.

*Madrid*, May 2. We have here great hopes of the speedy conclusion of the peace between the Crown and that of *France*. Yesterday was held here a *Junio* to consider of that important affair, and an Express was this day dispatcht away with the Articles of the peace.

The Earl of *Sandwich* is preparing for his departure from this Court, and to morrow intends to take his leave of the Queen Regent, and 'tis believed may leave this place within fifteen days.

The 21<sup>st</sup> past *Don Juan* arriv'd from *Pontevedra* at *Corunna*, having at *Vigo* taken a view of the Armada intended for his Convoy, but as yet we know not at what Port he intends to embark his Soldiers.

Letters of the 10<sup>th</sup> past from *Malaga* advise us of the arrival there of a great Hamburger of 36 Guns, and two Genoese ones of the same force, the other of 30 Guns who had been in a sharp fight with 11 men of War of *Algier*, by whom two other smaller ships of *Genova* that were in their company were taken, but that after several boardings wherein many men were killed on each side, these three were quitted by the Turks, after considerable marks of this encounter given and received of each side.

Letters of the 23<sup>rd</sup> past from *Alicant*, tell us of the arrival there that day of the *Saphire*, *Mermaid*, and *Mary-Rose*, three Fregats belonging to His Majesty of *Great-Britain*, who intended the next day to put to sea again to visit several Ports upon the Coast of *Barbary*.

*Vienna*, May 5. Here are lately arrived five vessels richly laden from *Turky* with Goods, belonging to that Company of Merchant, they having made very advantageous returns, and found hitherto Civil usage throughout the Turkish Dominions.

Here are lately arriv'd the Envoyes expected from the Cantons of *Switzerland*, who immediately went hence to *Luxemburg* to attend his Imperial Majesty, from whom they had a kind Reception and Audience, but the subject of their Negotiation not yet said.

*Hambourgh*, May 15. The Commission for the hearing and debating of the pretensions of the Duke of *Holslein Plun* to the County of *Oldenbourg* is deferred till June next ensuing, where 'tis believed His Majesty the King of *Denmark* intends to be present.

The Spanish Levies as yet continue here, and a Captain is also arriv'd here from *Holland*, to raise men for the service of the States of the *United Provinces*, under the Command of the Field Marshal *Wurrs*.

From *Warsaw* we are told that His Majesty is yet upon his journey, and may in little time be expected back again; and that His Electoral Highness of *Brandenbourg* is expected in *Prussia*; where 'tis believed he may have an Interview and Conference with His Majesty, under the pretext of an Hunting Match.

They farther tell us that several of the lesser Diets are al-

ready assembled in their respective Provinces according to their usual practice, in Order to the general Assembly which will shortly be held in that City, and that the Nobility are generally employ'd in taking a view of what forces they are able to draw into the Field, that they may be in readiness upon all occasions, and 'tis believed they intend at the general Assembly to appear on horseback in their Arms.

Other Letters inform us that all the Greater *Proland* is already in Arms, and that the rest of the Provinces might in little time appear in the same posture, to defend themselves (as they pretend) against such persons as endeavour by their private Contrivances to disturb the peace of the Kingdom.

*Hague*, May 17 This Morning His Highness the Prince of *Orange* departed hence intending for *Berg-op-Zoom*, to take a view of the Army which is drawn together neer that place: where are also expected the greatest part of the other Army from their Rendezvous at *Hardenburg*: The *Lunenbourg* forces which lately arriv'd there being ordered into such convenient Quarters in *Overyssel*, that at 24 hours warning they may with ease be drawn together; the Train of Artillery consisting of 80 pieces of Ordnance, with the Ammunitions and other necessaries provided for that Army are to be continu'd at *Zurphen* until a right understanding be fully settled between the States and the Bishop of *Munster*, both concerning the limits of their respective Territories, as also the reduction of the said Bishops forces to the number to which he is compris'd by the Treaty of *Cleves*. The States have order'd the speedy return of the Heer *Amstronghen* from *Munster*, but 'tis believed that Billop will in few daies send thither his Deputy, for the better composition of all affairs, and to Treat of a League between both parties.

The Sieur *Ulloa* Resident from the King of *Portugal* is still here, but under an Arrest for Debts contracted by him; Order is given for the sheathing of 12 of our men of War besides the Fleet already order'd out, designed for some long voyage. The Fleet will be in few days at sea, in order to the security of the peace. The Squadron of *Amsterdam* lying ready at the *Texel*; That of *Rotterdam* halting also forwards with all convenient diligence, the Soldiers and Mariners going daily aboard their ships.

The Heer *Lampadius* Resident from the Duke of *Lunenbourg*, is departed hence for *Cologne*, to be present there at an Assembly of the Princes of *Germany*, which is to be held there.

Some disputes have lately happened in *Ouvrissel* about the place for the Assembly of those States; some of them repairing to *Swolle*, others to *Campen*. The Heer *Van Saltlick* is lately arriv'd here from that Province, to give an account to the States General of this Contest, and some speedy order will be taken to reconcile them.

*Portsmouth*, May 10. On Wednesday last a ship of *Amsterdam* laden with Wines, Prunes and Oyls from *Bourdeaux* was wrack'd upon the *Needles*, but the men saved and a great part of the lading.

All the ships which were at *Spithead* are sail'd for the *Buoy in the Nore*, only the *Ree-Buck* remaining bound for *Guernsey*. The *Dragon* being ready to put out of the Harbour is detain'd by an Accident; one of the men endeavouring to pick out the shot out of one of the Guns with an halfe Pike, the Gun fired, killing two men, wounding three others, and disabling her main Mast. The *Tork* and *Ruby* may sail with the first fair wind.

*Newcastle*, May 10. Here are lately come in at several times about 160 sail of light ships which are all lading, and may in little time return for the south parts.

*Portsmouth* May 12. On Sunday last a Spanish man of War arriv'd here in nine daies from *Vigo* in *Spain* with 400 men aboard her bound for *Flanders*, and having taken in water and such provisions as they wanted, went yesterday again to sea; another ship which came out in company with the former, with the like number of men, was separated by storm, of whom they had no farther account; they affirm that *Don Juan* is now at *Corunna* with 6000 men, and that four ships lie ready there to put to sea.
