been much satisfied with his Reception in this City, went hence the last week on his way towards spain, attended by one of the Gall es belonging to this Republick 3 uncertain as yet whether he shall land at Barcellona, or some other Port of Spain.

From Mi. an we are told that the new Governour de los Balbaces was daily in consultation withthe principal Ministers of that State about the affairs of his Government, for the advantage of the interest of his Master the King of Spain: that he had by a publique Edict confirmed all the Establishments and Rules made by his Predecessor, and particularly what he had done in reference to the Church: and that he had commanded all Officers to attend their Commands, and had given out his Orders for a general Muster sometime the next Month, intending to take a view of all his forces both of Horse and Foot.

From Tyrin we are cold that several Compani.s are already march'd for the reinforcement of the Garrisons in Pignerolle, and that a confiderable fumme of Money was advanced for the perfecting of the Fortifications there; and that the Duke of Savoy was relolved in person to go privately to Vercelli to encourage the Fortification of that place, and to take a view of the forces which are there in Garrison.

Madrid, May 2. We have here grea hopes of the speed dy conclusion of the peace between this Crown and that of France. Nesterday was held here a Junto to consider of that important affair, and an Express was this day dispatcht away with the Articles of the peace.

The East of Sandwich is preparing for his departure from this Court, and to morrow intends to take his leave of the Queen Regent, and 'tis believed may have this place

within fifteen days.

The 21 part Don Fuan arrived from Pontenedra at Corunna, having at Vigo taken a view of the Atmada, in ended for his Convoy, but as yet we know not at what Port he intends to embark his Soldiers.

Letters of the 10th past from Malaga advise us of the arrival there of a great Hamburger of 36 Guns, and two Ge noue'es one of the same force, the other of 30 Guns who had been in a sharp fight with 11 men of War of Algier, by whom two other smaller ships of Genous that were in their company were taken, but that after several boa dings wherein many men were killed on each fige, these three were quitted by the Turks, after confiderable marks of this encounter given and received of each fide.

Letters of the 23 pail from Alecant, tell us of the arrival there that day of the Saphire, Mermaid, and Mary-Rose, three Fregats belonging to His Majesty of Great-Britain, who intended the next day to put to fea again to vi-fit feveral Ports upon the Coast of Earbary.

Vienna, May 5. Here are lately arrived five vessels rich'y laden from Tucky with Goods thelonging to that Company of Merchants, they having made very advantagious returns, and found hitherto Civil ulage throughout the Turkish Dominions,

Here are lately arrived the Envoyes expected from the Cantons of Swizzerland, who immediately went hence to Laxemburg to att nd his Imperial Majelly, from whom they had a kind Reception and Audience, but the subject

of their Negotiation not yet faid.

Hambourgh, May 15. The Commission for the hearing and debating of the pretentions of the Duke of Holficin Plun to the County of Oldenbourgh is deferred till Tune next ent luing, where 'tis believed His Majesty the King of Denmarke intends to be presented

The Spanish Levies as yet continue here, and a Captain is also arrived here from Holland , to raile men for the fervice of the States of the United Provinces, under the Com-

mand of the Field Mareshal Wurts.

From Warfam we are told that His Majesty is yet upon his journey, and may in little time be expected back again ; and that His Electoral Highness of Brandenbourgh is expected in Prussa; where its believed he may have an Epterview and Conference with His Majesty, under the pretext of an Hunting Match.

They farther tell us that leveral of the leffer Diets are al-

ready assembled in their resp dive Provinces according to their ulua practice, in Order to the general Aslembly which will shortly be held in that City, and that the Nebilty are generally employ'd in taking a view of what forces they are able to draw into the Field, that they may be in readirets upon all occasions, and 'tis believed they intend at the general Allembly to appear on hotseback in their Atms.

Other Letters inform us that all the Greater Pland already in Aims, and that the rest of the Provinces might in little time appear in the same posture, to desend themselves (as they pretend) against such persons as endeawour by their private Contrivances to diffurb the peace of the

Hague, May 17 This Morning His Highness the Prince of Orange departed hence intending for Berg-op-Zoom, to take a view of the Army which is drawn together neet that place: where are also ex, ested the greatest part of the other Army from their Rendesvouz at Hardenburg : The Lunenburg faces which lately arrived there being ordered into fuch convenient Quarters in Overyfel, that at 24 hours warning they may with ease be drawn together; the Train of Artillery confishing of 80 pieces of Ordnance, with the Ammunitions and other necessaries provided for that Army are to be continued at Zutphen until a right under-flanding be fully feiled between the State s and the Bishop of Munster, both concerning the limits of their respective Territories, as also the eduction of the said Bishops surces to the number to which he i contined by the Treaty of Gleves. The States have o dere the speedy return of the Heer Ameronghen from Munster, but 'tis believed that Bill op will in few daies fend hither his Deputy, for the better composure of all affairs, and to Treat of a League between both parties.

The Sieur Ulioa Resident from the King of Porsugal is fill h re, but under an Arrest for Debts contracted by him. Order is given for the sheathing of 12 of our men of War belides the Fleet already o dered out, designed for some long voyage. The Fleet wil be in few days at fen, in order to the security of the peace. The Squadron of Amsterdam lying ready at the Texel; That of Rosserdam haltning ello forwards with all convenient diligence, the Soldiers and Ma-

riners, going daily aboard their ships.

The Heer Lampadus Resident from the Duke of Lunenbourgh, is departed hence for Cologne, to be prefent there at an Allembly of the Princes of Germany, which is to be held there.

Some disputes have lately happened in Overiffel about the place for the Assembly of those States; some of them repairing to Swolle, others to Campen. The Heer Van Sallick is lately arrived here from that Provinces to give an account to the States General of this Contest, and some speedy order will be taken to reconcile them.

Portsmouth, May 10. On Wednesday last a ship of Amfierdam laden with Wines, Prunes and Oyls from Eourdeaux was wrack'd upon the Reedles, but the men faved and

a great part of the lading.

All the ships which were at Spitthead are sailed for the Busy in the Nore, only the Ree-Buck remaining bound for Guernsey. The Dragon being ready to put out of the Harbor is detained by an Accidentione of the men endeavouring to pick out the shor out of one of the Guns with an halfe Pikes the Gun fired, killing two men, wounding three others, and disabling her main Mast. The York and Ruby may fail with the first fair wind.

Neweastle, May to. Here are lately come in at several times about 160 sail of light ships which are all ladings and may in little time return for the fouth parts.

Portsmouth May 12. On Sunday last a Spanish man of War arrived here in nine daies from Figo in Spain with 400 men aboard her bound for Fanders, and having taken in water and fuch provisions as they wanteds went yesterday again to lea : another thip which came out in company with the former, with the like number of men, was separated by ftorm, of whom they had no farther account; they affirm that Don Fuan is now at Corunna with 6000 men, and that four thips lie ready there to put to lea.
