THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1873 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this

Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
